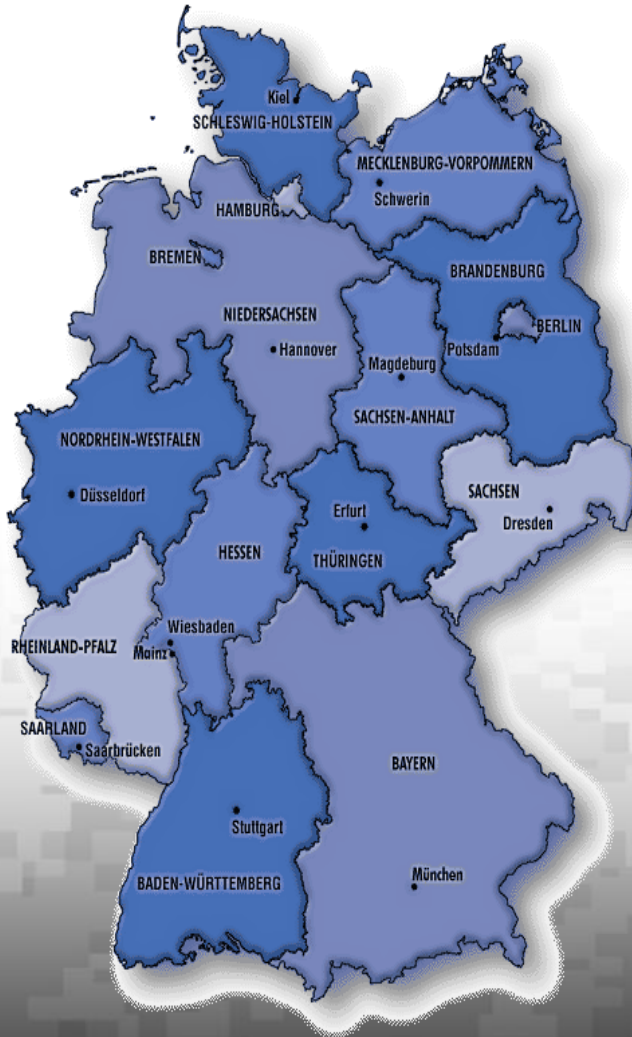

- Washer Fluid Type, some don't have freeze protection!
- Tires need to be at a minimum M&S rated, O to O.
- Profile 3mm for winter tires
- Tire Pressure, 1 pound per 10 degrees drop in temp
- Battery condition and load test
- Lights
- Exhaust Check
- Wiper Blades
- Check Belts
- Oil Check



Be sure to have: Ice Scraper, Snow Brush, Jumper Cables, Blanket, Extra Winter Clothing, First Aid Kit, Warning Triangle, Warn Vest, Bag of Sand & Small Shovel

Halloween Safety

- Halloween activities will be on 29 October 16
- Trick or treating in the housing areas will be from 1730 – 2100
- Trick or treating is limited to the exterior of buildings
Participants should not enter stairwells in multi-family units.
- Exercise extreme caution while driving through the housing areas during this time
- There will be an increased US and German Police presence in the housing areas during trick or treat hours
- There will be designated lost child rally points in each housing area



Dislocated Child Actions

- If a child doesn't know their address or surroundings a mobile patrol will be dispatched to the child's location
- The patrol will escort the child in the patrol vehicle to the designated rally point
- The child will remain there until their parent or guardian arrives under the supervision of the patrol and/or designated personnel assigned to monitor the point
- During the process an attempt will be made by the MP Desk to locate/contact the sponsor of the child via telephone

Seasonal Vehicle Inspection

6 Month POV Inspection for U.S. Forces (Military and Civilians)

- First line supervisors or platoon sergeants will visually inspect subordinates POV at least every 180 days and record their findings on DD Form 3626 in accordance with AER 190-1, CH 3 – 3
- Supervisors will enforce basic safety standards by ensuring their subordinates do not operate unsafe vehicles until the vehicle is repaired, registered as nonoperational or properly disposed of


Winter Recreation Sports Safety

- Don't exceed your limitations
- Get trained by an instructor or mentor with experience
- Use proper gear and personal protective equipment
- Good knowledge of any risks
- Stretch and warm up
- Avoid consuming alcohol



Travel Risk Planning System (TRiPS)

- Soldiers will complete TRiPS on leave, pass or TDY out of the local area and operating a private motor vehicle.
- Web-based self assessment which assists to mitigate risks and plan a safe trip IAW AR 385-10, CH 11-4.
- Immediate supervisor must review and approve the risk plan.

Tire Safety

Cars & Motorcycles

- Tread Depth In Germany - All tires must have a minimum tread of 1.6 mm.
- All Season Tires – Require the Snow Flake or M&S sign engraved on sidewall.
- Summer Tires – Legal during summer season only.
- Winter Tires In Germany – M&S all season qualify. Austria requires M&S November 1 to April 15, 4.0 mm depth.
- Reference: AER 190-1, para 3-3, (Note:)



Traffic Safety

Road Conditions

- In Germany weather conditions can change rapidly and effect current road conditions. Wet leaves and dirt on the road can make them very slippery.



- Make yourself visible in foggy conditions
- Ensure that head lights are working and properly adjusted. Use of rear fog light if the visibility is less than 50 meters. Speed limit is automatically 50kph.

Always adjust your speed to the existing road conditions!

Annual Winter Driving Training

Ensure all Soldiers and civilians, LNs, DOD Employees and authorized Volunteers complete the required Winter Drivers Orientation (WDO), the training period is from **26 Sep to 31 Oct 16** and report their training status to the 405th AFSB, Logistics Readiness Center (LRC), Driver Testing and Training station (DTTS).

Following options are available to complete this annual training requirements:

- Option 1: The DTTS located in Clay Kaserne, Bldg. 1023W, third floor in room 324 will provide classroom training. Classroom training will be provided by **appointment ONLY**. There will be two training sessions scheduled by appointment at **1300** for **LN**s and **at 1400** for **US/DAC personnel every Monday**. The classroom has a capacity for **25 people**, Units, Directorates and all section leaders must contact DTTS at **DSN 546-6077/6076/6075** or **CIV: 0611-143-546-6077/6076/6075** to schedule single and group trainings.
- Option 2: Units and Directorates can conduct their own training, the DTTS can provide a CD and stamp for sign out (limited sets are available **for maximum 7 days only**). After completion of the orientation training, instructors will filled out the attendance rosters for LNs and US/DAC, and stamped the military license, OF 346 (U.S. Government Motor Vehicle Operator's Identification) and DA Form 348 (Equipment Operator's Qualification Record). Units, directorates and all section leaders will submit the completed roster of personnel trained and return the stamp to DTTS. The DTTS is responsible of notifying the Transportation Motor Pool (TMP) and Safety Office.
- Soldiers and civilians (Local National, DOD Employees and authorized Volunteers) who are Non-Tactical Vehicle operators and have not complied with the mandatory training will not be authorized to dispatch or operate a Non-Tactical Vehicle in this garrison, **beginning 1 November 2016**.
- Once requirements have been completed the Soldiers and civilians will be allowed to resume NTV operations.
