Support Battalion, 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Division Support Command Plans Officer, Commander of Echo Company, 703rd Main Support Battalion, Battalion S-3 for the 26th Forward Support Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized) at Fort Stewart, Georgia; and Ordnance Branch Captains Assignments Officer, Officer Personnel Management Directorate, Human Resources Command in Alexandria, Virginia, Battalion Executive Officer for 10th Mountain Division Logistics Task Force in support of Operation Iragi Freedom (OIF), Joint Multi-national Logistics Officer for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's (NATO) Joint Forces Command (JFC) Brunssum, in the Netherlands and deployment to the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) Headquarters, Kabul, Afghanistan to establish the Theater Movement Coordination Cell (TMCC), COL LeVien has most recently returned from deployment as the Support Operations Officer for the 1st Theater Sustainment Command in Kuwait where he synchronized U.S. Central Command's (CENTCOM) theater sustainment requirements for multiple operations within the Middle East region.
