Colonel Anthony L. McQueen Commander, 402nd Army Field Support Brigade

Colonel Anthony L. McQueen assumed the duties as Commander of the 402nd Army Field Support Brigade on 3 August 2015.

COL McQueen is a native of Texas and a 1991 graduate of Sam Houston State University where he was commissioned through Army ROTC.

While stationed at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, from 1992 to 1995, COL McQueen served in several positions in the 1st Brigade, 25th Infantry Division, first as a Medical Platoon Leader in the 3/22nd Infantry Battalion; as the Treatment Platoon Leader, Company B, and subsequently Assistant S-3 of the 25th Forward Support Battalion. From 1996 to 1997, he commanded Company C, 302nd Forward Support Battalion, in 1st Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division, at Camp Casey, Korea. Assigned to Fort Sam Houston from 1997 to 2000, he served as the S-3 of the



187th Medical Battalion, and then later as an instructor in the Army Medical Department Officer Advanced Course. At Fort Hood from 2000 to 2002, COL McQueen was assigned as the S-3 of the 4th Forward Support Battalion, and as the Chief, Medical Plans and Operations, 4th Infantry Division. Assigned as the Chief of Operations of the 62nd Medical Brigade, at Fort Lewis, Washington, from 2002 to 2004, he deployed with the brigade to Iraq for Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2003. Returning to Fort Hood in 2005, COL McQueen served as the Deputy Division Surgeon, 1st Cavalry Division. Later, as Executive Officer, 115th Brigade Support Battalion, 1st Brigade Combat Team, Colonel McQueen deployed to Iraq again from 2006 to 2007, where he also served as the G-4 Operations Officer in the 1st Cavalry Division, then known as Multi-National Division, Baghdad (MND-B). He returned to Fort Sam Houston, Texas in 2008, as the Chief of Training (G-7), Army Medical Department Center and School. From 2010 to 2012, COL McQueen commanded the 302nd Brigade Support Battalion, a multifunctional logistics support battalion, where he was responsible for providing integrated sustainment support and force health protection. COL McQueen was next assigned to the Office of the Surgeon General as the G-33 where he served as the Chief of Operations and was responsible for the United States Army Medical Command Operations Center.

COL McQueen is a graduate of the Army Medical Department's Officer Basic Course; he has also completed the Combined Logistics Officer Advanced Course, the Command and General Staff College at Ft Leavenworth and recently earned a Master of Science Degree in National Security Strategy from the National War College.

COL McQueen's military awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit; Bronze Star Medal (two awards); the Meritorious Service Medal (three awards); the Army Commendation Medal (two awards); the Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal (earned twice), the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Medal, Korean Defense Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon, and the Overseas Ribbon (four awards). He also wears the Expert Field Medic Badge, the Parachutist Badge, the Air Assault Badge, and the Army Staff Identification Badge

COL McQueen is married and they have two children.
