## What is the EFM Program?

The **Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)** assists Active Duty Soldiers in managing the dual demands of a military career and having a Family member with special needs, whether medical, emotional or educational. The purpose of EFMP is to give consideration to the special needs of the Family member during the reassignment process and help minimize the disruption that those needs might have upon the Family during assignments.



## Who qualifies for EFMP?

An Exceptional Family Member is any Family member enrolled in DEERS who requires special medical or educational services based upon a diagnosed chronic physical, intellectual, or emotional needs. Enrollment in EFMP is mandatory per AR 608-75

## Benefits

- Family support through Systems Navigation
- Eligibility for Respite Care
- TriCare Extended Care Health Option (ECHO)
- Support with Individual Education Planning (IEP) meetings
- Special housing consideration, based upon medical necessity
- Support at Special Needs Accommodation Process (SNAP) meetings for CYS Services
- Relocation assistance
- Support groups
- Workshops and trainings
- Resources, referrals and more!

## How do I enroll?

- Enrollments, updates, and disenrollment are processed by the EFMP office at the Winn Army Community Hospital (WACH) or designated staff at the Tuttle Health Clinic.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### ***Will enrollment in the EFMP affect my ability to deploy?***

No. All Service Members enrolled in EFMP remain world-wide deployable and assignable.

### ***Will EFMP enrollment hurt my chances for promotion?***

No. Promotion and selection boards DO NOT have access to your EFMP status.

### ***Will enrollment limit duty assignments?***

No. EFMP will assist in coordinating a duty station that will meet both the career and EFM needs. This can be accompanied or unaccompanied.

### ***Will my command be notified of my enrollment in EFMP?***

Yes. Battalion level Commanding Officers or higher are able to request a list of EFMP enrolled Service Members in their unit. However, this list does not include any detailed information about diagnosis or specific needs, nor will it be released to other unit personnel. Any further enrollment information will be kept confidential, unless written authorization is received from the enrolled Soldier.

### ***Why should I enroll in the EFMP?***

By enrolling, you are ensuring the needs of your Family are being met while allowing you to focus on your job and mission readiness.
