SUBJECT: Hispanic Heritage Month Proclamation

1. 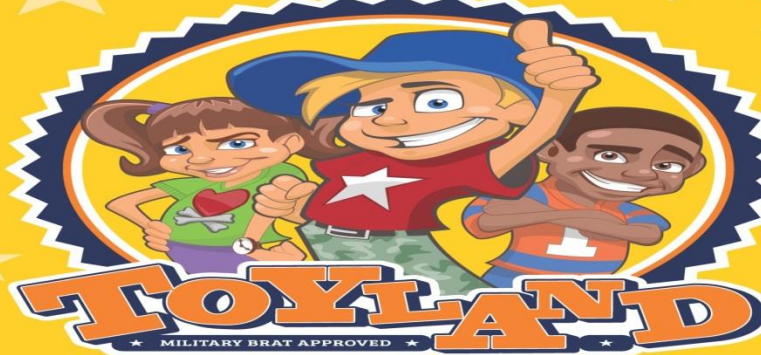

MEDDAC Highlights



- **Referral Process improvement – Instruction sheet available online and when given a referral to make it easier for patients to navigate the process.**
- **Automated Call Distribution changes – Verizon contract being modified to make it easier for patients to call in and leave messages when needed.**
- **ICE Comments – tracking and responses – Patient Advocate**

- **Joint Outpatient Experience Survey (JOES)**
- **Flu shots for high risk patients are available now at Mary Walker Clinic. Flu shots for Soldiers and the general population will not arrive until the Oct/Nov timeframe. There will be no flu mist used at DoD facilities this year due to concerns about its efficacy.**
- **21-22 Post Full Scale Exercise – WACH will take part but all services will still be open.**
- **28 September – WACH Organizational Day – Many hospital and clinic services will be closed that day to include the outpatient pharmacy to allow staff participation. The ER will be open for urgent care.**



Joint Outpatient Experience Survey (Joes)



- **The Department of Health Affairs launched a new patient satisfaction survey across the DoD called JOES, or the Joint Outpatient Experience Survey. This outpatient survey combines and standardizes the previous surveys used by the Army, Navy and Air Force.**
- **JOES will focus on beneficiaries' healthcare experience, whether the care is received at an MTF or in the TRICARE network.**
- **JOES ensures beneficiaries receive the same questionnaire to relate their healthcare experiences.**
- **JOES has a direct financial impact on our MTFs. The greater number of “satisfied” surveys our beneficiaries complete, the more services potentially for our community.**
- **These surveys will provide direct feedback to our providers—from front desk clerks to the physicians treating the patient—the intent is to improve the support and care we provide our beneficiaries.**
