Family Programs Evolve to Meet Changing Needs, Budget Restrictions



IMCOM Celebrates 10th Birthday

On Wednesday, Oct. 26, IMCOM will mark its 10th year of supporting Soldiers, Families and senior commanders by providing quality services and programs, delivered consistently across installations. IMCOM was originally designated the Installation Management Agency in August 2002, when the Army issued General Order 4 creating the command as a field operating agency of the Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Installation Management. General Order 4 followed a period in which Secretary of the Army Thomas White and Gen. Eric Shinseki, Army Chief of Staff, had envisioned installation transformation as the initial focus for transforming the Army as a whole. In October 2006, Secretary of the Army Francis Harvey and Army Chief of Staff Gen. Peter Schoomaker created the Installation Management Command. The

This action placed the former IMA, the former Community and Family Support Center (renamed the Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation Command), and the former Army Environmental Center (renamed the Army Environmental Command) in a single three-star command as a direct reporting unit to OACSIM.

DoD-Wide MWR Survey Seeks Feedback From Customers

The Defense Department has launched the 2016 Morale, Welfare and Recreation Customer Satisfaction Survey, officials from the Department of Defense Morale, Welfare, Recreation and Resale Policy Office announced today. This is the fourth time the Defense Department has conducted a DoD-wide survey measuring customer satisfaction, officials said, noting that previous MWR surveys were conducted in 2009,



2011 and 2014. Defense leaders said that customer feedback through the survey responses can make a significant difference in MWR programs. For example, they said, improvements in fitness programs and facilities, outdoor recreation programs and single-service-member programs were a direct result of the 2014 MWR survey, so participants can complete the survey knowing their comments are heard. QC Honor Flight Set for Oct. 27

The Quad-City Honor Flight Hub has announced it is now accepting Vietnam veterans for the group's third and fourth flights this year. Applicants must have served between Feb. 28, 1961 and May 7, 1975, to be considered a Vietnam War Era Veteran. The program operates on donations from individuals and organizations. Volunteers plan and coordinate the flight events. All flights depart on a non-stop charter from the Quad City International Airport to Washington D.C., and return at approximately 10 p.m. the same day. Trained guardians are assigned to the veterans to ensure they have a safe, memorable, and rewarding experience. Vietnam veterans within a 75 mile radius of the Quad Cities are encouraged to apply. They must submit an application along with a copy of their DD-214 (available at http://honorflightqc.org/application-forms). Applicants are cell 4-8 weeks prior to the honor flight date to advise them they have been selected for the next scheduled flight. Applications are dated in the order they are received. With a little forethought and creativity, parents and guardians can keep their little ghouls and goblins safe. Adults should always supervise children under the age of 12 when they head out to haunt the streets in search of treats. Children should only visit well-lit houses and remain outside at all times, while adults stay as close to the home as possible. A flashlight will make trick-or-treaters more visible to motorists, so make sure they carry one. Also, stay on the sidewalks and off streets and lawns.

Rock Island National Cemetery to Commemorate Veterans Day

The Rock Island National Cemetery will have a Veterans Day Ceremony on **Friday, Nov. 11**, at 1 p.m., Rock Island National Cemetery, at the main flagpole. The keynote speaker for the Veterans Day ceremony will be Maj. Gen. Edward Daly, commanding general, U.S. Army Sustainment Command, and senior commander, Rock Island Arsenal. The ceremony will include wreath placement, an honor salute, and taps. Veterans Day is intended to thank and honor all those who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime. A Congressional Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday – a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day had primarily been a day set aside to honor Veterans of World War I. However, following World War II and the Korean War, Veterans service organizations urged Congress to amend the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of new legislation in 1954



(Public Law 380), Nov. 11 became a day to honor American Veterans of all wars. (More on Veterans Day)

Senate, received unanimous support and was signed into law by President William Jefferson Clinton on Oct. 27, 2000. (More)

TRICARE Expands Coverage for Treatment of Congestive Heart Failure

Congestive Heart Failure is now a covered diagnosis under the TRICARE cardiac rehabilitation benefit. Heart failure occurs when the heart is unable to pump enough blood to meet the body's needs. This may happen when the heart muscle itself is weaker than normal or when there is a defect in the heart that prevents blood from getting out into the circulation. If you are experiencing these symptoms, talk to your health care provider. If you have been diagnosed with heart failure, it's important for you to manage and keep track of symptoms and report any sudden changes to your healthcare team. Providers of cardiac rehabilitation services must be TRICARE-authorized hospitals or freestanding cardiac rehabilitation facilities. All cardiac rehabilitation services must be ordered by a physician. (More)

Blood and Tissue Samples Help DoD Make Major Contribution to Cancer Moonshot

For more than 25 years, the Department of Defense has collected and stored blood serum from all of its members, and the tissues of many. Those millions of samples are being stored at the Department of Defense Serum Repository in Silver Spring, Maryland, along with a tumor bio-repository run by the Murtha Cancer Center. These efforts are paying off for the national Cancer Moonshot, the White House-led effort to make 10 years of progress against cancer in just five years by bringing together resources from the government and private sectors. "Our leadership has been working to come up with actionable items to address the Cancer Moonshot's overall mission of advancing progress against the disease," said Army Col. Craig Shriver, director of the Murtha Cancer Center, the DoD's lead cancer research and treatment facility. "The military has some unique resources for this fight." (More)

VA Streamlining Process for Medical/Surgical Purchases

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is taking a major step toward system improvement in the processes used to purchase medical and surgical supplies. VA is significantly enhancing the Medical/Surgical Prime Vendor (MSPV) program by replacing it with the Medical/Surgical Prime Vendor - Next Generation (MSPV-NG) program. MSPV-NG purchasing capability greatly improves VA's supply chain and aligns directly with VA Secretary Robert McDonald's 12 Breakthrough Priorities designed to transform VA into a Veteran-centric organization of excellence. "Similar to VA's successful pharmaceutical purchasing and distribution program, MSPV-NG aims to improve acquisition planning, sourcing, and delivery, which will allow the organization to benefit from the best pricing, timely access to supplies, and waste reduction," said McDonald. By standardizing processes, VA's MSPV-NG program reduces excess inventories and leverages VA's purchasing power. The program increases the involvement of clinicians in sourcing products, giving them direct input in selecting supplies that can be used across VA medical centers and clinics. Medical, surgical, dental, and select prosthetic and laboratory supplies will now be available at nationally negotiated rates. This benefit, along with flexible delivery options, positions VA to address critical medical and surgical supply needs, ultimately improving the quality of care for the Veterans we serve. The MSPV-NG program launches across all VA facilities Dec. 1. (More)
