The redesigned website features a mega menu (a drop-down navigation bar) which simplifies the website and provides a more predictable experience when searching for pages and topics. WTC is using today's technology to provide stakeholders with information and tools to learn about programs, resources and benefits.

- Featured categories This section will be updated with recent initiatives and additional information on the topics most requested by Soldiers, Families and Cadre throughout the calendar year.
- Mobile ready Simpler viewing and navigation across a wide range of devices, from smartphones to tablets to desktop computers
