\*This notification was filed, in Docket OST-2005-21709, in response to Centurion Air Cargo's application for new U.S.-Mexico all-cargo exemption authority. In its response, Atlas advises that Atlas' designation for U.S.-Mexico all-cargo service is dormant and should be available for reassignment. Under the U.S.-Mexico aviation agreement, up to a total of five U.S. carriers may provide all cargo services in the country-pair market. Amerijet, Astar, Federal Express, and United Parcel Service are currently providing all-cargo service between the United States and Mexico. In light of Atlas' dormancy, one U.S.-Mexico all-cargo designation opportunity is available.
