\*\* The available funds are divided in two groups: 80 percent for the States that contain at least 1.5 percent of the total public land and 20 percent for the other States with less than 1.5 percent of the total public land. Subsequently, the funding is distributed according to the road miles, visitation, public bridges, and land area from the National Park Service, the Forest Service, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, the Bureau of Land Management and the Corps of Engineers in accordance with the formula. The values, specifically road miles that account for 55% of the funding, are subject to change and can drastically affect the States funding distribution from one year to another.
