

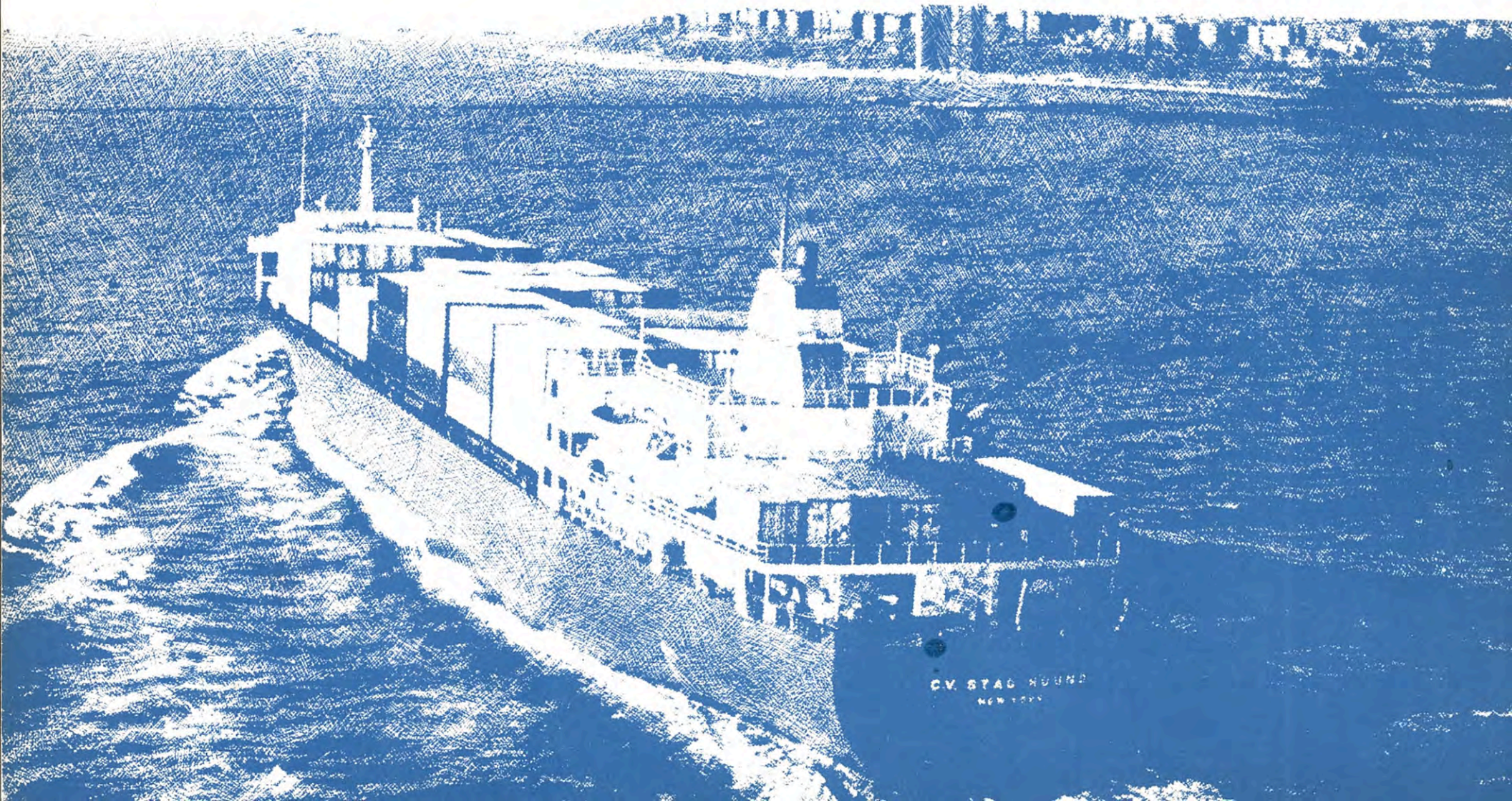
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CONTAINERIZED CARGO STATISTICS

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INTRODUCTION

The statistics exhibited in this publication were collected from Container/Trailer Report - Foreign Trade, Form MA-578A (Revised 12-77) by the Maritime Administration, as required by Section 212(A) of the Merchant Marine Act of 1936 (as amended).

These reports are filed by a designated agent or the operator of any vessel of 1,000 or more gross registered tonnage carrying 25 or more 8x8x20 foot (Twenty-foot Equivalent Units (TEU)) cargo containers/trailers units. In addition to the filings of all commercial merchant vessels, forms are filed for all voyages of merchant vessels operated by or for the account of the Department of Defense, except vessels of the Military Sealift Command fleet.

Although most of the cargo movements described in this publication are generally assumed to be within the scope of liner service, the statistics shown include containerized cargo transported on non-liner service and, in some cases, transported

aboard tanker vessels. All information reported is based upon the port-of-loading and the port-of-unloading of cargo and does not necessarily reflect the origin or the ultimate destination of the cargo.

The form MA-578A was revised and then instituted as of January 1, 1978. This revision eliminated two statistical categories (number of containers and cargo cubic feet) from the 1978 statistics while creating two new statistical categories (Loaded TEU's and Empty TEU's). A collection of Twenty-foot Equivalent Units (TEU's) was included for the purpose of creating a better working knowledge of the actual flow of containers through individual U.S. and foreign ports.

U.S. Containerized Foreign Trade - 1980

U.S. oceanborne containerized foreign trade registered a record 34.5 million long tons of cargo during calendar year 1980 (Table I). This represented an increase of 9 percent over 1979 containerized cargo tonnage, which was the largest annual percentage increase since 1976. Commercial containerized cargo tonnage increased 9.6 percent and totalled 33.6 million long tons. Containerized cargo during 1980 also totalled 3.7 million 20-foot equivalent units (TEU's), which was an increase of 11 percent over 1979. Commercial TEU's amounted to 3.6 million, also an 11 percent increase.

Containerized import tonnage, after peaking during 1978, decreased for the second consecutive year. During 1980, 12.9 million long tons of cargo were imported in containers, a decrease of 7 percent when compared to 1979. This was even lower than the total tonnage figure for 1976. Commercial cargo import tonnage totalled 12.8 million long tons and represented a decrease of 6.8 percent compared to 1979. Import TEU's during 1980 totalled 1.5 million, a decrease of 2 percent.

Export containerized cargo tonnage, representing 63 percent of the U.S. oceanborne container trade, increased 22 percent during 1980 to reach 21.6 million long tons. This was the largest one-year absolute tonnage growth (3.9 million long tons) since containerized cargo statistics were first collected in calendar year 1970. Commercial cargo export tonnage totalled 20.8 million long tons during 1980, an increase of 23 percent over 1979. Total export TEU's increased 21 percent and totalled 2.2 million, while commercial TEU's increased 22 percent and totalled 2 million.

Total containerized cargo carried by the U.S.-flag fleet increased by 13 percent during 1980, totalling 10 million long tons (Table II) and ending a three-year

decline. Also, there was an increase in the percentage participation by the U.S. fleet (from 28 to 29 percent) for the first time since 1974. The amount of commercial containerized cargo transported in U.S. bottoms increased 13.9 percent over 1979 and totalled 9.2 million long tons, which was the second largest annual figure for that category (the highest being 9.3 million during calendar year 1976). This represented 27.3 percent of the total U.S. commercial containerized foreign trade. Total TEU's (1.3 million) and commercial TEU's (1.1 million) carried by the U.S. fleet during 1980 represented the largest annual total for each category. The U.S. fleet accounted for 34 percent of total TEU's and 32 percent of commercial TEU's.

U.S.-flag containerized imports totalled 4 million long tons during 1980, an increase of 9.8 percent over 1979, and reached 556 thousand TEU's (13.4 percent above 1979). The U.S.-flag participation in total containerized import tonnage rose from 26.4 percent during 1979 to 31.2 percent during 1980, and the U.S. fleet's percentage of total import TEU's climbed from 32 to 37 percent. U.S.-flag commercial cargo totalled 3.9 million long tons for a 10.7 percent increase and amounted to 30.8 percent participation; U.S.-flag vessels carried 546 thousand TEU's, a 16.8 percent increase and 36.8 percent participation.

U.S.-flag containerized export cargo reached a record high with nearly 6 million long tons and increased 15.4 percent over 1979, but participation declined from 29.2 percent during 1979 to 27.7 percent during 1980. The total TEU's exported on U.S.-flag vessels increased 12 percent during 1980 and amounted to 714 thousand which represented nearly 33 percent of all export TEU's. U.S.-flag commercial exports by container totalled 5.2 million long tons (16.4 percent increase and 25.2 percent

participation) and 589 thousand TEU's (12 percent increase and 28.6 percent participation).

Major Flags

The West German fleet ranked second behind the U.S. fleet as the major carrier of commercial containerized cargo tonnage during 1980, accounting for 12.1 percent. The Japanese fleet ranked third with 10.1 percent participation, while the Singapore fleet moved from a ranking of seventh during 1979 to fourth during 1980, accounting for 7.7 percent of the commercial tons carried. Ranking fifth through tenth were the fleets of Denmark (6.3 percent), Liberia (6.1 percent), United Kingdom (5.6 percent), Panama (3.2 percent), Sweden (3.0 percent) and the Republic of China (2.0 percent).

Leading Trades

The Far East (Trade Route Nos. 12, 22 and 29) continued to be the leading area for containerized traffic, reaching 14.6 million long tons of cargo in 1980 (42 percent of the total U.S. container tonnage). This amounted to a 19 percent increase over 1979 Far East tonnage. The U.S./Far East trade accounted for 42 percent (5.3 million long tons) of total U.S. containerized imports and 43 percent (9.3 million long tons) of total U.S. containerized exports. Following the U.S./Far East trade in terms of total containerized tonnage was the U.S./Europe trade (Trade Route Nos. 5-7-8-9, 6, 11, 21, 26 and Trade Area I) which totalled 10.3 million long tons, a slight decrease from 1979. Imports by container on these trade routes totalled 3.9 million long tons while exports totalled 6.4 million long tons.

U.S. containerized trade with Mediterranean countries (Trade Route Nos. 10, 13 and 65) decreased 10 percent during 1980 when compared to 1979, and totalled 2.6 million long tons. U.S. imports from the Mediterranean totalled 1.2 million long tons while exports totalled 1.4 million long tons. U.S./Caribbean (Trade Route Nos. 4, 19 and 23) containerized trade during 1980 totalled 1.9 million long tons which was an increase of

35 percent over 1979. The U.S./Australasia (Trade Route Nos. 16 and 27) containerized trade decreased slightly during 1980 and accounted for 1.6 million long tons of cargo. Together, these five trades accounted for 90 percent of the total U.S. containerized oceanborne foreign trade during 1980.

Principal Trade Routes

During 1980, Trade Route No. 29 (U.S. Pacific/Far East) accounted for 33 percent of the total U.S. containerized foreign trade cargo tonnage, reaching 11.5 million long tons for an increase of 19 percent over the 1979 total (Table IV). Trade Route No. 29 represented 29 percent of the total U.S. container import tonnage with 3.7 million long tons (Table V) and 36 percent of total container export tonnage with 7.8 million long tons (Table VI).

Trade Route No. 5-7-8-9 (U.S. North Atlantic/United Kingdom and Continental Europe) ranked second in terms of total tonnage with 6.1 million long tons, which represented almost 18 percent of the total U.S. container trade and was an increase of 2 percent over the 1979 total. Import tonnage on Trade Route No. 5-7-8-9 dropped 23 percent below the 1979 figure and totalled 2.3 million long tons, while exports increased 27 percent to reach 3.7 million long tons.

U.S. Atlantic/Far East Trade Route No. 12 sustained its ranking of third during 1980 with a total of almost three million long tons, which was an increase of 18 percent over the 1979 tonnage figure. Imports via this route increased 6 percent and exports increased 33 percent in total tonnage. Trade Route No. 10 (U.S. North Atlantic/Mediterranean) and Trade Route No. 21 (U.S. Gulf/United Kingdom and Continental Europe) ranked fourth and fifth, respectively, despite decreases in total tonnage. Container cargo on Trade Route No. 10 declined 14 percent and totalled 1.6 million long tons while Trade Route No. 21 traffic decreased 17 percent to a total of 1.4 million long tons.

Trade Route No. 4 (U.S. Atlantic/Caribbean) moved from a ranking of eighth during 1979 to sixth during 1980 with an increase of 29 percent in total tons, reaching 1.3 million long tons. Export tonnage (1.1 million) on this route increased 53 percent during 1980 while the import figure fell 26 percent below the 1979 total.

The remaining routes on which container tonnage totalled over one million long tons were Trade Route No. 11 (U.S. South Atlantic/United Kingdom and Continental Europe) with 1.3 million and Trade Route No. 16 (U.S. Atlantic and Gulf/Australasia) with 1.1 million. Among the trade routes included in the top 20, Trade Route No. 19 (U.S. Gulf/Caribbean) experienced the largest percentage growth (52 percent) reaching 558 thousand long tons, followed by Trade Route No. 91 (Puerto Rico/All Foreign) which increased 43 percent to total 573 thousand long tons.

U.S. North Atlantic

Containerized foreign trade cargo tonnage transported through U.S. North Atlantic (Maine through Virginia) ports during 1980 increased 2 percent over the 1979 figure and totalled 12.8 million long tons (Table VII). The U.S. North Atlantic trade represented 37 percent of all U.S. containerized foreign trade cargo during 1980 compared to 40 percent during 1979. Containerized imports through U.S. North Atlantic ports declined 17 percent during 1980 and fell to 5.3 million long tons while exports rose more than 22 percent to reach 7.5 million long tons. Total TEU's moved through U.S. North Atlantic ports reached 1.3 million, with imports dropping 14 percent to 574 thousand and exports increasing 22 percent to 776 thousand. The number of reported empty TEU's transported through the U.S. North Atlantic increased almost 100 percent during 1980, with 146 thousand empties versus 75 thousand in 1979.

The port of New York remained the leading U.S. port in terms of total containerized cargo tonnage with seven million long tons (Table VIII) and total TEU's with 750 thousand (Table IX) during 1980. The total tonnage figure represented a 1 percent increase over 1979 and amounted to 20 percent of the total 1980 U.S. container trade tonnage and 55 percent of the 1980 U.S. North Atlantic tonnage. New York led all U.S. ports in total containerized import tonnage with 3.4 million long tons despite a 17 percent decline from 1979, and was also the leading U.S. port in export tonnage with 3.6 million long tons which was an increase of 28 percent over 1979.

Baltimore was the second leading North Atlantic port and ranked fifth overall with 2.6 million long tons which represented a 6 percent increase over 1979. Like New York, Baltimore's import tonnage fell significantly, by 18 percent, to 813 thousand long tons, exports rose 23 percent to reach 1.8 million long tons, Norfolk ranked seventh overall with 1.8 million long tons (1.4 million exports), Philadelphia ranked fourteenth with 760 thousand long tons and Boston ranked sixteenth with 357 thousand long tons.

U.S. South Pacific (California)

California ports accounted for 10.5 million long tons of containerized cargo during 1980 which represented 30 percent of all U.S. container trade and was an increase of 16 percent over 1979. The total TEU figure reached 1.2 million during 1980, a 23 percent increase. Import tonnage remained virtually unchanged, totalling 3.5 million long tons, while export tonnage increased 26 percent and totalled almost 7 million long tons.

Los Angeles, the leading California port, ranked second among all U.S. ports with four million long tons, which

was 10 percent above its 1979 total. Export tonnage through Los Angeles facilities increased 23 percent and totalled 2.6 million long tons. Oakland ranked third among California ports with 3.1 million long tons (2.4 million exports) which represented a 16 percent increase over 1979. The port of Long Beach experienced the largest percentage increase (42 percent) in total containerized cargo tonnage among all U.S. West Coast ports and totalled 2.4 million long tons, which ranked sixth among all U.S. ports. Imports through Long Beach totalled 1.1 million long tons (23 percent increase), while exports totalled 1.3 million long tons (64 percent increase). San Francisco was the remaining California port with substantial containerized cargo tonnage, accounting for 906 thousand long tons, which was a decrease of 4 percent below the 1979 figure.

U.S. South Atlantic

U.S. South Atlantic containerized foreign trade increased 14 percent, in terms of total tonnage during 1980, and fell just shy of four million long tons. Import tonnage increased 2 percent and totalled 1.2 million long tons, while exports improved 20 percent and nearly reached 2.8 million long tons. Total TEU's declined 11 percent during 1980 totalling 318 thousand.

The port of Miami became the leading U.S. South Atlantic port, moving ahead of Charleston in total container tonnage. Total container tonnage moving through Miami increased 32 percent during 1980 and totalled 1.3 million long tons, ranking ninth among all U.S. ports. Export tonnage moving through Miami increased 48 percent and totalled 891 thousand long tons. Charleston ranked tenth among all U.S. ports with 1.2 million long tons, which represented a decrease of 5 percent from the 1979 total. Savannah experienced the largest percentage growth (48 percent) among all U.S. Atlantic ports, in terms of total tonnage, with a total of 826 thousand long tons. Among the remaining U.S. South Atlantic ports accounting for substantial containerized cargo

tonnage during 1980 were Jacksonville (284 thousand long tons) and Wilmington, North Carolina (167 thousand long tons).

U.S. North Pacific

U.S. Pacific Northwest (PNW) ports accounted for an increase in total containerized cargo tonnage of 18 percent during 1980 and almost reached 3.6 million total long tons. Import tonnage decreased 5 percent and totalled 1.2 million long tons while export tonnage increased 35 percent and totalled 2.4 million long tons. Container TEU's totalled 389 thousand during 1980 representing a 20 percent increase over 1979.

Seattle, totalling 2.9 million long tons and increasing 28 percent over 1979, overtook Baltimore to rank fourth among all U.S. ports and accounted for 81 percent of the total container tonnage moving through the PNW coastal district. Exports through Seattle increased 51 percent during 1980 and totalled 1.9 million long tons. Portland ranked second in the PNW, in terms of cargo tonnage, with 480 thousand long tons which was a decrease of 14 percent from 1979. Tacoma, the third leading PNW port, declined 7 percent in containerized cargo tonnage and totalled 173 thousand long tons.

U.S. Gulf

Containerized cargo tonnage transported through U.S. Gulf ports during 1980 dropped 1 percent below 1979 and totalled slightly more than 2.9 million long tons. Import tonnage increased 6 percent and totalled 1.2 million long tons while export tonnage dropped 6 percent and totalled 1.7 million long tons. Total TEU's moving through the U.S. Gulf Coast declined 14 percent during 1980 and totalled 280 thousand.

Houston, the Gulf's leading container port, ranked eighth among all U.S. ports with 1.4 million long tons (5 percent increase) and accounted for almost 50 percent

of the U.S. Gulf's total container tonnage. Import tonnage moving through Houston increased 18 percent and reached 606 thousand long tons, while export tonnage dropped 3 percent to 849 thousand long tons.

New Orleans accounted for a little over one million long tons of containerized cargo during 1980 which represented a 14 percent decline and dropped the port from a ranking of tenth among all U.S. ports during 1979 to eleventh for 1980. Total containerized cargo tonnage moving through Galveston increased 34 percent during 1980 to 189 thousand long tons, with export tonnage increasing 80 percent to 124 thousand long tons. Gulfport was the fourth ranked U.S. Gulf port, in terms of containerized tonnage with 176 thousand long tons.

Puerto Rico, Great Lakes, Hawaii and Alaska

Containerized foreign trade cargo tonnage moving through Puerto Rican ports during 1980 increased 43 percent and totalled 573 thousand long tons with 62 thousand TEU's (35 percent increase). Import tonnage totalled 259 thousand long tons (52 percent increase) and export tonnage reached 314 thousand long tons (36 percent increase). San Juan was the leading port with 345 thousand long tons and ranked seventeenth among all U.S. ports. Ponce, Puerto Rico became an active foreign trade container port during 1980 accounting for 225 thousand long tons, which was an increase of 317 percent above 1979 total tonnage.

U.S. Great Lakes ports accounted for 143 thousand long tons and 11 thousand TEU's of containerized cargo tonnage during 1980, representing a 10 percent and 15 percent decline, respectively, from 1979. The leading U.S. Great Lakes port was Chicago with 52 thousand long tons (10 percent decline), accounting for 37 percent of the U.S. Great Lakes containerized tonnage. Detroit

ranked second behind Chicago with 43 thousand long tons, while Cleveland and Milwaukee each accounted for 24 thousand long tons.

Containerized foreign trade tonnage moving through Hawaii increased 16 percent during 1980 and totalled 108 thousand long tons. Total TEU's reached 11 thousand, an increase of 10 percent. Hawaiian exports increased 39 percent while the import tonnage fell 6 percent. Honolulu accounted for all of the Hawaiian foreign trade container movements.

Containerized foreign trade tonnage moving through Alaska increased by over 100 percent to total 11 thousand long tons, all of which were exports. The number of TEU's totalled slightly over one thousand during 1980. Kodiak totalled six thousand long tons while Dutch Harbor followed with the remaining five thousand long tons of containerized cargo.

Foreign Countries and Ports

Containerized commercial cargo transported between the United States and Japan during 1980 increased 18 percent, reached 7.8 million long tons and accounted for 23 percent of the total U.S. containerized trade (Table X). Total TEU's transported reached 904 thousand, an increase of 23 percent. Imports from Japan totalled three million long tons representing a 7 percent increase and 24 percent of all U.S. containerized imports. U.S. exports to Japan totalled 4.8 million long tons representing a 27 percent increase over 1979. Kobe was the leading Japanese port, as well as the overall leading foreign port, accounting for 3.6 million long tons, which represented a 15 percent increase over the 1979 total (Table XI). Tokyo was the second ranking Japanese port and the sixth ranked foreign port with 1.5 million long tons. Yokohama ranked seventh overall with an increase in total tonnage of 42 percent to reach 1.4 million

long tons. Nagoya totalled 780 thousand long tons (16 percent increase), Osaka totalled 235 thousand long tons (8 percent increase) and Shimizu totalled 140 thousand long tons (53 percent increase).

The Netherlands was the second ranking country in terms of cargo tonnage and container TEU's during 1980, with 3.5 million long tons, representing a 9 percent increase over the 1979 total and 398 thousand TEU's (39 percent increase). U.S. imports from the Netherlands totalled 1.3 million long tons while exports totalled 2.2 million long tons, each representing 10 percent of the overall U.S. totals for those categories. Rotterdam ranked second among all foreign ports with 3.3 million long tons, which was an increase of 8 percent over 1979. Amsterdam experienced a 42 percent increase in containerized cargo tonnage and reached 167 thousand long tons.

The third ranking country was the Republic of China (Taiwan), moving ahead of West Germany with 2.8 million long tons and 341 thousand TEU's, which represented 21 percent and 31 percent increases, respectively. The leading Taiwan ports were Kaohsiung, which ranked fifth overall with 1.6 million long tons (58 percent increase), and Keelung, which ranked eighth overall with 1.2 million long tons (6 percent decrease).

Hong Kong ranked fourth among all countries and was the third ranking port with 2.6 million long tons and 309 thousand TEU's, an increase of 29 and 25 percent, respectively, over 1979. U.S. exports of containerized cargo to Hong Kong totalled 1.7 million long tons and represented a 42 percent increase over 1979.

West Germany fell from third to a ranking of fifth in calendar year 1980, accounting for 2.4 million long tons of containerized cargo (6 percent decline). TEU's totalled 306 thousand, an 8 percent decline. The

leading West German ports were Bremerhaven, which ranked fourth overall with 1.7 million long tons (8 percent decline), Hamburg (576 thousand long tons) and Bremen (122 thousand long tons). The United Kingdom followed West Germany as the sixth leading country with 1.7 million long tons, and Liverpool became the leading United Kingdom port with a 47 percent increase in tonnage to 453 thousand long tons. Other United Kingdom ports with substantial containerized tonnage were Felixstowe (444 thousand long tons), Southampton (338 thousand long tons) and Greenock, Scotland (310 thousand long tons).

The remaining countries which accounted for more than one million long tons of containerized cargo trade with the United States during 1980 were Italy (1.4 million), Australia (1.2 million), and France (1.1 million). All three countries experienced decreases in their total tonnage compared to 1979. The leading Italian ports were Leghorn (724 thousand long tons), Genoa (337 thousand long tons), Naples (185 thousand long tons), and Palermo (136 thousand long tons). Leading Australian ports were Melbourne (496 thousand long tons), Sydney (378 thousand long tons) and Brisbane (211 thousand long tons). The leading French container port was LeHavre with 897 thousand long tons, followed by Fos with 107 thousand long tons.

Of the top 40 countries, in terms of total containerized cargo tonnage in U.S. oceanborne foreign trade, Colombia experienced the largest percentage growth (113 percent). Panama followed with an 88 percent increase while Trinidad/Tobago increased 80 percent and Venezuela increased 73 percent. Among the top 50 foreign ports, the largest growth rate was experienced by Port of Spain, Trinidad (142 percent), followed by Puerto Cabello, Venezuela (99 percent), Buenos Aires, Argentina (65 percent) and Kingston, Jamaica (63 percent).

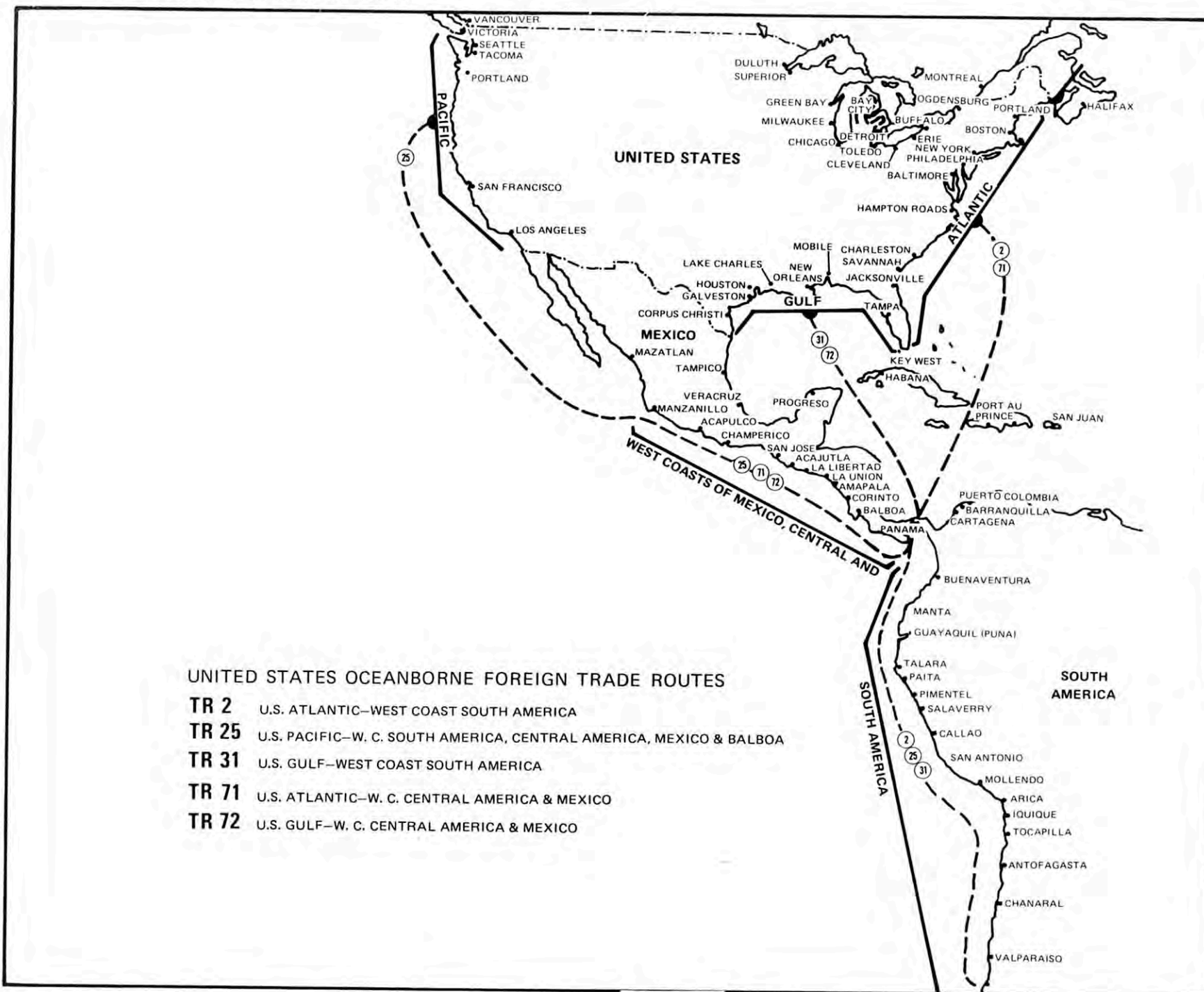

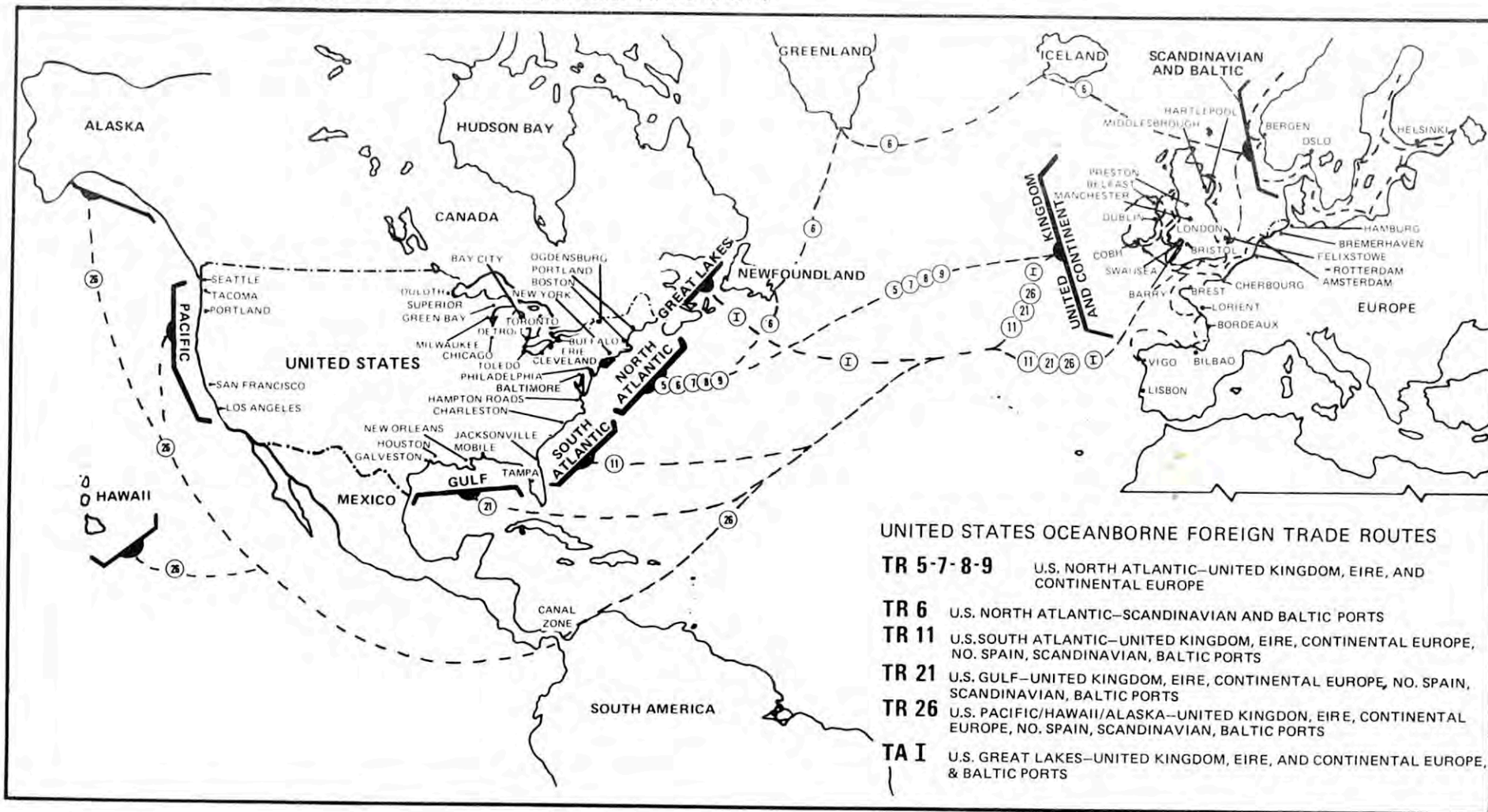
