Railroad Safety Advisory Committee Task Statement: Revision of Event Recorder Requirements

Task No.: 97-3

Date presented to the RSAC: June 24, 1997.

Purposes:

To enhance rail safety through any appropriate revision of and/or addition to existing event recorder requirements to improve accident investigation, reconstruction, and analysis methodologies. To consider, and as appropriate act upon, National Transportation Safety Board recommendation for locomotive cab voice recorders.

Description:

Recommend, as appropriate based on data and analysis, revisions and additions to the regulations governing locomotive event recorders (49 CFR Part 229), regarding ① the specific data elements that should be recorded, ② parameters to ensure event recorder survivability under fire, water, and impact conditions, ③ event recorder inspection, test, maintenance, and data requirements, and ④ whether event recorders should be required to be physically positioned in a lead versus trailing locomotive within a consist.

Examine the need for and feasibility of requirements governing the design, implementation, functionality, test, maintenance, and associated parameters relating to the installation of voice recorders in locomotive cabs. Advise FRA regarding response to the related recommendation of the National Transportation Safety Board and follow through, as needed, based upon the response.
