The next step in the process will be to develop match agreements between Western Federal Lands and the State/Local Agency partners. The amount of funds allocated will depend on finalizing these match agreements. Funding for these projects is not guaranteed. Funding beyond 2014 is dependent on reauthorization of the Access Program by Congress. The Montana PDC does not have a firm date for the next call for projects under the Access Program, but another call is anticipated within the next 2 years.
