



FLAP Project Selection Process

Each FLAP project is selected from a pool of applications submitted by the facility owner in response to a state-wide call for projects. The applications are screened, rated, and ranked using PDC approved rating criteria. Based upon these evaluations, the proposed projects are recommended for programming within the available funding for each state. Memorandum of Agreements (MOA) are coordinated and executed for each programmed project prior to obligation of FLAP funds. There was one call for projects, from November 25, 2013, until January 11, 2014, that generated one application totaling \$3,050 funds requested, which was subsequently pulled from consideration by the facility owner.





The PDC established goals for the state that included preference to:

- "Shovel Ready" projects for final Programming Decisions Committee (PDC) ranking.
- Projects that have prior public dollar investments will be considered ahead of new project proposals.
- Funds used for pedestrian access improvements, or utility relocation on access roads.
- Projects that are National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) compliant and on existing State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).
