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

Success story: The City of Lowell, in partnership with the Lowell National Historical Park (LNHP) project proposes the Merrimack Riverwalk Phase II extension. The City of Lowell's Riverwalk Bridge Street Node project will extend the "Mile of Mills" Riverwalk from the Boott Cotton Mills to the Massachusetts Mills providing an important pedestrian link in Lowell's urban waterway system. The project will fill in a missing link between the Riverwalk and the Eastern Canalway at Bridge Street. It will also be a critical piece of a regional 50 mile Merrimack Trail and tie into the Massachusetts Bay Circuit Trail.

This combined pedestrian system serves LNHP visitors between attractions, residents traveling between destinations and recreational users. The ability to move people safely through the city is critical to the success of LNHP and the city's economic vitality. Additional visitors can be accommodated without detracting from the character of the area's historic resources.

FLAP Project Selection Process

Each FLAP project is selected from a pool of applications submitted by the facility owner in response to a Statewide call for projects. The applications are screened, rated, and ranked using PDC approved rating criteria. The PDC unanimously agreed which projects met the established State program goals and conformed with the project ranking criteria contained in the "Call for Projects SOP." Based upon these evaluations, the proposed projects are recommended for programming within the available funding for each state. Memorandum of Agreements (MOA) are coordinated and executed for each programmed project prior to obligation of FLAP funds. There was one call for projects that generated two applications totaling \$1,050,000 funds requested.
