

Success story: The Improving Access to the Ninigret National Wildlife Refuge project will resurface Park Lane, beginning at the East Entrance to the Fish and Wildlife Service- Ninigret National Wildlife Refuge and heading north. A sign plan will be developed to identify new signs that will be installed as part of this project. Pavement markings will be installed according to Town of Charlestown standards to the roadway.

This project will provide significantly improved access to the refuge. Consistent, high quality signage and pavement markings will improve public safety and help visitors find their way to the refuge, which is currently a challenge. The road repair will enhance the visitor experience and allow for other transportation modes. Enhancing visitor experiences will attract more visitation as people learn of the unique recreational opportunities and conservation of natural resources this area offers.







## FLAP Project Selection Process

Each FLAP project was selected from a pool of applications submitted by the facility owner in response to a Statewide call for projects. The applications were screened, rated, and ranked using PDC approved rating criteria. The PDC unanimously agreed which projects met the established State program goals and conformed with the project ranking criteria contained in the "Call for Projects SOP." Based upon these evaluations, the proposed projects were recommended for programming within the available funding for each state. Memorandum of Agreements (MOA) were coordinated and executed for each programmed project prior to obligation of FLAP funds. There was one call for projects, from July 15, 2013, until August 16, 2013, that generated one application totaling \$40,992 funds requested. The project was programmed using all of the available funds.
