- 1. <u>GRANTEE</u>: The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region II and persons conducting operations under the direction of EPA within the Hurricane Sandy disaster areas of NY and NJ
- 2. <u>PURPOSE AND LIMITATION</u>: This emergency special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain hazardous materials in support of the recovery and relief efforts within the Hurricane Sandy disaster areas of New York and New Jersey under conditions that may not meet the Hazardous Materials Regulations. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR Parts 171-180 in that compliance with the HMR is required to the extent practical.
- 5. <u>BASIS</u>: This emergency special permit is based on the application of United States Environmental Protection Agency Region II dated November 7, 2012, submitted in accordance with § 107.117 and a determination that it is necessary to prevent significant injury to persons or property by facilitating expedited transportation of hazardous materials within the disaster area and additional information dated February 13, 2013.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. Compliance with the HMR is required to the extent practicable. When compliance with the HMR is not possible or practicable, shipments may be offered or transported under alternative safety requirements imposed by the grantee.

b. The hazardous materials identified in paragraph 6. above may be transported to a staging area within 50 miles of the point of origin. Further transportation of the hazardous materials from the staging area must in full compliance with the HMR.

- 8. <u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: Operations under this special permit are limited to the EPA Region II or those operating under the direction of the EPA Region II.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle
- 10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS:

a. A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport hazardous materials covered by this special permit.

b. The shipper must provide written notification to the carrier of the hazardous material and packagings being offered, at the time the shipment is initiated.

c. Bulk transportation of hazardous materials by rail freight is not authorized under this special permit.
