DOT-E 6861 (First Revision)

- 1. Teledyne McCormick Selph, Hollister, California, is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to offer packagings prescribed herein of certain Class A explosives for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes a DOT specification 21P/2SL or 2U composite container and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
- 2. <u>BASIS</u>. This exemption is based on Teledyne McCormick Selph's application dated March 14, 1978, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
- 3. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class)</u>. A liquid slurry explosive identified as Teledet (TM) having no liquid explosive ingredient nor any chlorate, Class A explosive.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). High explosives.
- 5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.65(a).
- 6. MODE OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle.
- SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES.
- a. Packaging prescribed is a 20-gallon capacity DOT Specification 21P fiber drum with DOT 2SL or 2U polyethylene liner with one of the following closures:
 - 1. A single 2-inch diameter polyethylene cap extending through the fiber drum head.
 - 2. A 2-inch diameter cap, as in (a) above, and a 3/4 inch diameter vent with cap located 180° from the 2-inch cap.
 - 3. A 2-inch diameter cap and a 3/4 inch diameter vent extending through a steel drum head.

- b. Net weight not to exceed 200 pounds.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. Not applicable.
- 9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Operations as soon as practicable.
- 10. EXPIRATION DATE. April 30, 1980.
