## ADVISORY

IF YOU ARE A HOLDER OF AN EXEMPTION THAT AUTHORIZES THE USE OF A PACKAGING WITH A MAXIMUM CAPACITY LESS THAN 450 L (119 GALLONS) OR A MAXIMUM NET MASS LESS THAN 400 KG (882 POUNDS), PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT YOUR EXEMPTION MAY NOT BE RENEWED BEYOND SEPTEMBER 30, 1996. IN ADDITION, NO NEW CONSTRUCTION OF PACKAGINGS WHICH FALL WITHIN THE NON-BULK CAPACITIES LISTED ABOVE ARE AUTHORIZED AFTER SEPTEMBER 30, 1994. THIS IS CONSISTENT WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW PACKAGING REQUIREMENTS ADOPTED UNDER DOCKET HM-181. ANY APPLICATION SUBMITTED TO THIS OFFICE TO RENEW AN EXEMPTION BEYOND THE SEPTEMBER 30, 1996 DATE WILL BE DENIED UNLESS THE APPLICATION CONTAINS SUPPORTING INFORMATION TO JUSTIFY THE CONTINUATION OF THE EXEMPTION.

## DOT-E 7654 (THIRD REVISION)

- 1. J. T. Baker Inc., Phillipsburg, New Jersey, is hereby granted an exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer packages prescribed herein of a flammable liquid for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the use of a glass bottle not exceeding 500 milliliter capacity inside a metal container overpacked in a DOT Specification 12B fiberboard box and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated. Note: Reference to 49 CFR sections in this exemption are to regulations in effect on September 30, 1991.
- 2. <u>BASIS</u>. This exemption is based on J. T. Baker Inc.'s application dated May 14, 1993, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105
- 3. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS</u> (<u>Descriptor and class</u>). Acetaldehyde, classed as a flammable liquid. **NOTE:** <u>Effective October 1, 1993, the appropriate numeric hazard class or division descriptions must be used in place of the written hazard class descriptions.</u>
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Acetaldehyde.
- 5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.119(f).
- 6. <u>MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED</u>. Motor vehicle and rail freight.
- 7. <u>SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES</u>. Packaging prescribed is a glass bottle not exceeding 500 milliliter capacity properly cushioned inside a metal container and further overpacked in a DOT Specification 12B fiberboard box as described in Texas Eastman Company's application dated December 31, 1976. Not more than one glass bottle is authorized to be packed in each outside container.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reoffer them for transportation provided no modifications or changes are made to the packages, all terms of this exemption are complied with and a current copy of this exemption is maintained at each facility from which such reoffering occurs.

9. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (49 CFR 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must also inform the AAHMS, in writing, as soon as practicable of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under this exemption.
