DOT-E 8558
(SECOND REVISION)

1. Trojan Corporation, Salt Lake City, Utah, is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to offer packages prescribed herein of a class A explosive for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the transport of a pharmaceutical described as an initiating explosive and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
2. BASIS. This exemption is based on Trojan Corporation's application dated November 15, 1984, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). 11% Erythritol Tetranitrate and 89% Lactose, class A explosive.
4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Initiating explosive.
5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.53.
6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle.
7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. Packaging prescribed is a 5 gallon polyethylene pail containing not over 40 pounds of material overpacked in a 15 gallon DOT 37A steel drum, with ring bolt closure, with the space between the pail and drum filled with a water/antifreeze mixture.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
 - a. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
 - b. Drivers must have been instructed as to necessary safeguards and proper procedures in the event of unusual delay, fire or accident.
9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Regulation as soon as practicable.
10. EXPIRATION DATE. April 1, 1987.
