1. GRANTEE: Warner Bros., Inc.
Sunderland, MA
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
 - a. This exemption authorizes the filling and discharge of two non-DOT specification portable tanks containing gasoline, while remaining securely mounted on a truck chassis. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
 - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR §§ 173.32(a)(1) and 173.242 in that non-DOT specification portable tanks are not authorized except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of Warner Bros., Inc. dated April 8, 2005, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

- a. PACKAGING - Prescribed packagings are two (2) non-DOT specification steel portable tanks manufactured by Welding Division, O.R. Cote Company. The tanks have nominal water capacities of 210 and 340 gallons and have a baffle plate welded in the middle of the tank. The tank must be secured to the truck chassis as described in the applicant's petition.
- b. TESTING - Each portable tank must be reinspected and retested once every 2 years in accordance with § 180.605 as prescribed for DOT Specification 57 portable tanks.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- a. A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered for transportation.
- b. Transportation is limited to private carriage and within the State of Massachusetts only.
- c. MARKING - Each portable tank must be plainly marked on both sides near the middle in letters at least two inches high on a contrasting background, "DOT-E 9070."
- d. No new construction is authorized.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:

- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8 who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this exemption are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this exemption must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety -- OHMEA, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this exemption.
