DOT-E 9907

- 1. General Defense Corporation, York, Pennsylvania, is hereby granted an emergency exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer packages prescribed herein of class A explosives for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the transportation of unfuzed explosive projectiles, class A explosive, in non-DOT specification packagings, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
- 2. BASIS. This exemption is based on General Defense Corporation's application of December 22, 1987, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.103, based on a serious economic loss.
- 3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Unfuzed explosive projectiles (8 inch M106 and 155 mm M107), classed as class A explosives.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Explosive projectile.
- REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.56(a) and (c)(1).
- 6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle, rail freight and cargo vessel.
- 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. Packaging prescribed is palletization, 8 rounds per pallet for the M107 projectile, and 6 rounds per pallet for the M106 projectile, in accordance with applicable Department of Defense (DOD) drawings, identified as ARDC 9362569 for the M107 projectile and ARDC 9341621 for the M106 projectile, on file with the application in the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation (OHMT).

## 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

- a. Shipment must:
  - 1. Be prepared and offered to the carrier in accordance with DOD safety requirements.
  - Originate at the Kansas Army Ammunition Plant, Parsons, Kansas, destined for a port of export or a proving ground.
  - 3. Be made in carload or truckload lots.
- b. Shipment is pursuant to a non-DOD third party sale involving the holder of this exemption and the country of Jordan.
- c. In lieu of 49 CFR Part 107, Appendix B(1), each motor vehicle must be conspicuously marked on the right side, near the front, in letters at least 2 inches high, "DOT-E 9907"
- d. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle and cargo vessel used to transport packages covered by this exemption.

9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the OHMT as soon as practicable.
