- 1. Pennwalt Corporation, King of Prussia, Pennsylvania, is hereby granted an emergency exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer a package prescribed herein of a flammable liquid for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes a one time shipment of carbon disulfide in a DOT Specification 105A300W tank car tank which is overdue for retest, and provides no relief from any regulations other than as specifically stated.
- 2. BASIS. This emergency exemption is based on Pennwalt Corporation's application of January 28, 1988, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.113, based on a protection of life and property.
- 3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Carbon disulfide, classed as a flammable liquid.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Carbon disulfide.
- 5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR Part 107 Appendix B(1), 173.31(b) and (c).
- 6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Rail freight.
- 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEAUSRES. Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification 105A300W tank car tank with identifying marking, GATX 77989, meeting all DOT requirements (49 CFR Parts 100-299), except the tank is overdue for retest.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
- a. Shipment must be between North Little Rock, Arkansas and Memphis, Tennessee.
- b. The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is to be notified immediately if any unusual incident occurs during the movement by contacting the:

- The provisions of 49 CFR Part 107, Appendix B to Subpart B (1) do not apply.
- Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
- 9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation (OHMT) as soon as practicable.
