- 1. Hughes Aircraft Company, Tucson, Arizona, is hereby granted an exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer for transportation packages prescribed herein of Class A explosives for transportation in commerce, subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the shipment of rocket ammunition with explosive projectile, class A explosive, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
- 2. <u>BASIS</u>. This exemption is based on Hughes Aircraft Company's application dated January 28, 1988, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.103 and the public proceeding thereon.
- 3. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class)</u>. Rocket ammunition with explosive projectile, identified as tow missiles, classed as Class A explosive.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Rocket ammunition with explosive projectile.
- REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 172.101, Column 6(b); 173.57(a), 175.30.
- 6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Cargo-aircraft only.
- 7. <u>SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES</u>. Packaging is as prescribed in the Department of Defense (DOD) drawings numbered 13218444 dated December 19, 1986, on file with the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation (OHMT).

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

- a. The following information must be provided in writing, to OHMT, prior to each shipment:
 - i. Name of the air carrier;
 - ii. The type, quantity and gross weight of the tow missiles in the shipment;
 - iii. Identify the origin and destination points including fuel stops involved in the shipment;
 - iv. Dates and times of scheduled departure from origination point and estimate arrival at fuel stops and destination point; and
 - v. Copy of the approvals issued by the airport managers for each U.S. airport involved in the flight.
- b. Air carriers must be identified to OHMT as required in paragraph 8(a)(i) and approved in writing by OHMT prior to each shipment.

- c. The carrier must conform to the requirements of 49 CFR 175.320(b).
- d. A copy of the air bill must be forwarded to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation, Exemptions Branch within 10 days after completion of each shipment made under this exemption.
- e. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each aircraft used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
- f. This exemption does not grant authority to use foreign controlled airspace or airports outside the United States.
- g. Any fuzes in the ammunition must be of the safe and arm type and be in the "safe" position during transportation.
- 9. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package or damage to the packaging must be reported to the OHMT as soon as practicable.
- 10. EXPIRATION DATE. March 15, 1989.
