- 1. American Cyanamid Company, is hereby granted an emergency exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer a package prescribed herein of an oxidizer for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the shipment of nitric acid in a DOT Specification 111A60W7 tank car tank which is equipped with a 45 psi safety valve, and provides no relief from any regulations other than as specifically stated.
- 2. <u>BASIS</u>. This emergency exemption is based on American Cyanamid's application of February 9 and 10, 1988 and June 1, 1988, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.113, based on a serious economic loss.
- 3. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class)</u>. Nitric acid (over 40%), classed as an oxidizer.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Nitric acid.
- 5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 179.201-1.
- 6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Rail freight.
- 7. <u>SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES</u>. Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification 111A60W7 tank car tank (39 tank cars UTLX 42900 thru UTLX 42938) meeting all DOT requirements (49 CFR 100-299), except the tank is equipped with a 45 psi safety valve in lieu of a 35 psi safety valve.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
 - a. The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is to be notified immediately if any unusual incident occurs during the movement by contacting the:

- b. Tank cars must be stenciled "DOT-E 9931" in four inch letters above the DOT specification stenciling.
- c. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
- 9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation (OHMT) as soon as practicable.
