- 1. Vulcan Chemicals, Birmingham, Alabama, is hereby granted an emergency exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer a package prescribed herein of a nonflammable gas residue for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the transportation of a DOT Specification 105A500W tank car tank with defective vapor valves for the transportation of chlorine residue, and provides no relief from any regulations other than as specifically stated.
- 2. <u>BASIS</u>. This emergency exemption is based on Vulcan Chemicals' application of August 17, 1990, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.113, and a determination that it is necessary for protection of life and property.
- 3. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class).</u> Chlorine, classed as a nonflammable gas.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Chlorine
- REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.29(c)(2) and 179.100-13.
- 6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Rail freight
- 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES.
 - a. Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification 105A500W tank car tank, UTLX 28191, with a defective vapor valves, which have been equipped with two Chlorine "C" kits to prevent the emission of chlorine vapors.
 - b. The manway protective housing cover while opened must be chained or otherwise fastened so that it cannot change position during transportation.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
 - a. Shipment must be between Groos, Michigan and Port Edwards, Wisconsin, a distance of 236 miles, using the most direct route available via the Wisconsin Central.
 - b. The tank car must be marked DOT-E 10446 above the DOT specification number in at least four inch letters on a contrasting background.

c. The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is to be notified if any unusual incident occurs during the movement by contacting the:

- d. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
- 9. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>. Any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation (OHMT) as soon as practicable.
- 10. EXPIRATION DATE. October 31, 1990.
