

- 1. GRANTEE: Oriental World, Inc., Portland, Oregon
- 2. <u>PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:</u> This emergency exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain 1.4G explosives, (Snappers and Pull-string trick noise makers) as nonregulated. This exemption provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated herein.
- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR Sections 100-199.
- 5. <u>BASIS</u>. This exemption is based on Oriental World, Incorporated's emergency application dated October 26, 1993, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.113 and a determination that it is necessary to preclude serious economic loss and supplemental letter dated December 23, 1993.
- 6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR 172.101):

7. PACKAGING AND SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

- a. <u>PACKAGING</u> Approximately 3315 fiberboard boxes containing the Snappers and 500 fiberboard boxes containing Pull-string trick noise makers.
- c. <u>MARKING</u> The marking requirements of 49 CFR Part 107, Appendix B are waived.
- SPECIAL PROVISIONS This exemption authorizes a one-time originating at Tacoma, Washington, destined for Portland, Oregon.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle.



- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>. Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act:
 - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - o Registration required by 49 CFR 107.106 et seq., when applicable.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect unless a regulation has been amended making the exemption no longer necessary.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (49 CFR 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
