7. PACKAGING(S) and SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

- b. An locomotive may be used as a buffer car to meet the provisions of restriction 2 of §174.85(d) provided the locomotive is in tow with no MU connection devices connected, the batteries are disengaged, no persons are on board, and the engine is not running.
- c. MARKING: The marking requirements of 49 Sections 172.203(a) and 172.301(c) are waived.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. Not as a condition of this exemption.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Rail freight.
