1. GRANTEE: Port of Longview  
Longview, Washington
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION: This emergency exemption authorizes the one-time transportation in commerce of a class 9 material in eight gondola rail cars, each with a maximum gross weight greater than 263,000 pounds. This exemption provides no relief from any regulations other than as specifically stated.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR §§ 173.24b(d)(2) and 173.26 in that the bulk packaging loaded with a hazardous material exceeds the maximum weight of lading marked on the specification plate.
5. BASIS. This emergency exemption is based on a recommendation of the Federal Railroad Administration and the Port of Longview's application, dated April 22, 1999, submitted in accordance with § 107.117 and a determination that it is necessary in order to protect life and the environment.

7. PACKAGING(S) and SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. "DOT-E 12267" must appear on the shipping papers.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Rail freight.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: The Federal Railroad Administration is to be notified if any unusual incident occurs during the movement by contacting the:

11. COMPLIANCE. Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:

- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8 who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or

packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
