1. GRANTEE: BP Chemicals, Inc.  
Naperville, IL
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION: This emergency exemption authorizes the one-time transportation in commerce of a Class 3 material in one DOT specification rail car that exceeds the maximum authorized gross weight. This exemption provides no relief from any regulations other than as specifically stated.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 172.302(c); § 173.24b (d) (2) and § 173.26.
5. BASIS. This emergency exemption is based on BP Chemicals, Inc.'s application of August 2, 2000, submitted in accordance with § 107.117 and a determination that it is necessary in order to protect life and property.
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:
  - a. PACKAGINGS: Packaging prescribed is as required in 49 CFR Part 173, Subpart B and § 173.242(a). The rail car number is TEIX 25048.



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8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS: In accordance with § 172.203(a), the shipping paper used in connection with this shipment must bear the notation "DOT-E 12529" in association with the shipping description.
9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Rail freight.
10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS:
- a. A one-time transportation is only authorized from East St. Louis, IL to Valparaiso, IN, utilizing the most direct rail route possible.
  - b. Prior to transportation, the grantee must ensure that the rail car is inspected to determine that the car complies with all other applicable regulatory requirements and is in safe condition for transportation.
11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.
- Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8 who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.
- No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect unless a regulation has been amended making the exemption no longer necessary.
12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable.

(Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
