1. GRANTEE: MI L.L.C.  
Anchorage, Alaska
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This emergency exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of a Class 8 material in UN1H1 plastic drums, which exceeds the package quantity limitations when transported by cargo aircraft. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 172.101 Hazardous Materials Table Column (9B) in that the quantity limitation for a class 8 material by cargo aircraft is exceeded; and the marking requirements of § 172.301(c).
5. BASIS: This emergency exemption is based on the application of MI L.L.C., dated January 27, 2003, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.117 and a determination that it is necessary to prevent significant economic loss.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING: - Packagings prescribed are 80 UN1H1 drums having an approximate capacity of 220 liters.

b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS:

(1) No more than 16 drums at a time may be transported aboard any one aircraft.

(2) The drums must be secured within the aircraft to prevent movement prior to transportation.

(3) The transportation will be from Deadhorse, Alaska to Alpine, Alaska

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

b. The marking requirements of § 172.301(c) are waived.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Cargo aircraft only.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each aircraft used to transport packages covered by this exemption. The shipper must furnish a copy of this exemption to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:


- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when this exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
