1. GRANTEE: U.S. Department of Energy
Richland, WA

2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
 - a. This exemption authorizes the one-way, one-time transportation in commerce of sodium in a non-DOT specification containment system for waste disposal. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
 - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 173.211(a) in that the use of a non-DOT specification packaging system is not authorized, except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the applications of the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) dated January 7, 2004, submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Packaging prescribed is a non-DOT specification stainless steel containment system known as a cold trap and economizer manufactured by Gulf United Nuclear Fuels Corporation in 1972. Details of the containment system are described in the application on file with the Office of Hazardous Materials Exemptions and Approvals (OHMEA).

b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS -

(1) All pipe penetrations of the packing must be sealed with welded stainless steel caps.

(2) The cold trap and economizer must be placed horizontally and secured onto wooden pallets with wood forms and bracing used to provide additional protection for the piping protrusions.

(3) No other hazardous materials may be loaded on the transport vehicle.

(4) The cold trap and economizer may only be transported from Richland, Washington to Gibsonia, PA with no intermediate pick-ups or deliveries.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A current copy of this exemption must be on file at the facility where the package is offered for transportation.

b. The cold trap must be plainly marked with exemption number "DOT-E 13445" as specified in §§ 172.302(b) and (c).

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

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10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
 - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.

 - o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.

 - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when this exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
