
FMCSA POCKET GUIDE TO LARGE TRUCK AND BUS STATISTICS (2013)

- 30,057 fatal crashes on the Nation's roadways
- 3,806 (12.7%) of these crashes involved at least one large truck or bus and resulted in a fatality

- Official inspection of a CMV to determine compliance with FMCSR.
- Conducted by Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) inspector.
- Major data provider for carrier safety ratings.

Safety Measurement System (SMS)

The Safety Measurement System (SMS):

- Uses crash records and ALL roadside inspection safety-based violations.
- Assigns weights to time and severity of violations.
- Calculates safety performance based on seven BASICs.
- Reports motor carriers' safety performance monthly.

Crash Indicator

SMS Benefits

- Quantifies the on-road safety performance of carriers and drivers.
- Aligns violations included in SMS with Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA) inspection levels.
- Identifies carriers involved in transporting HM or passengers.
- Separates crash data.
- Aligns paper and electronic logbook violations.
- Aligns SMS with IEP regulations.
- Triggers the intervention process.



CSA Operational Model




BASICs Exceeding the Threshold

Carrier BASIC Assessments are determined by two inputs:

- SMS results:
 - Percentiles are calculated based on on-road performance.
 - o BASIC displays Alert if percentile is above the threshold.
- Serious violations discove during investigations.

Vehicle Maintenance BASIC Measure













Individual Driver Facts

Here are some facts about how driver data is NOT used:

- FMCSA does not assign safety ratings to an individual CMV driver.
- Driver evaluation ratings are not available to employing motor carriers or the public.
- Pre-Employment Screening Program data is only released with the driver's permission.
- A driver's violation history at a previous carrier does not affect the SMS rating for the current employer.


COMPREHENSIVE

Pre-Employment Screening Program

Pre-Employment Screening Program

What is the Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP)?

- Mandated by Congress separately from CSA 2010.
- Screening tool that allows motor carriers and drivers to purchase inspection and crash history report.
- Requires driver consent.
