Congress, Federal agencies, and transit industry stakeholders rely on the data from the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) National Transit Database (NTD) to make sound planning and investment decisions, and to determine the condition of our Nation's transit systems. FTA apportions over \$6 billion annually in formula grants to nearly 2,000 urban and rural transit agencies based on NTD data. The majority of this funding goes through the Urbanized Area Formula Program<sup>\*</sup> to the 30 largest transit systems, which account for about 85 percent of the Nation's transit infrastructure. FTA's Urbanized Area Formula Program received \$4.16 billion in fiscal year 2012, in addition to \$5.44 billion in American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds received in 2009. The NTD includes critical information such as safety, ridership, state of good repair, and fiscal wellbeing from each transit agency receiving Federal funds, and is intended to facilitate the uniform collection and reporting of transit agency information.

Accordingly, the objective for this audit is to evaluate FTA's oversight of NTD data to ensure that submissions from grant recipients and beneficiaries of transit funds for the Urbanized Area Formula Program are complete, accurate, and timely.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>\*</sup> The Urbanized Area Formula Program (49 U.S.C. 5307) makes Federal resources available to urbanized areas and to Governors for transit capital and operating assistance in urbanized areas and for transportation related planning. An urbanized area is an incorporated area with a population of 50,000 or more that is designated as such by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census. Funding is apportioned based on legislative formulas.
