In 2008, Congress passed the *Passenger Rail Investment and Improvement Act* (PRIIA) in order to strengthen intercity passenger rail services in the United States. This comprehensive legislation reauthorized Federal appropriations to the National Railroad Passenger Corporation (Amtrak), and includes provisions to assist rail stakeholders, including the Department of Transportation's (DOT) Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), in improving services, operations, and facilities.

Historically, FRA has focused primarily on promoting and overseeing railroad safety and disbursing grants to Amtrak. PRIIA, however, has significantly expanded FRA's responsibilities. These new responsibilities include developing a national rail plan that promotes an integrated and efficient national rail system, the creation of grant programs for High-Speed Intercity Passenger Rail, Intercity Passenger Rail Service Corridor Capital Assistance, and Congestion Relief, and other initiatives for improving and promoting intercity passenger rail services.

As required by PRIIA Section 221, we are initiating an audit to assess FRA's implementation of the provisions of this Act. The objectives are to: (1) evaluate FRA's progress in implementing its PRIIA responsibilities; (2) assess the effectiveness of FRA's process for implementing grants, studies, and oversight as required by PRIIA; and (3) determine the impact of PRIIA's implementation on rail stakeholder operations.

Amtrak's Inspector General (IG) will conduct a concurrent assessment of the company's progress in implementing PRIIA's Amtrak-related provisions. For additional information regarding the objectives, scope, and methodology of the
