The Office of Inspector General plans to conduct an audit of the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Automatic Dependent Surveillance-Broadcast (ADS-B) program. ADS-B is a cornerstone technology for FAA's future air traffic control system, the Next Generation Air Transportation System (NextGen). expected to improve safety, enhance system capacity, and reduce Agency operating costs.

At the request of the Chairmen of the House Transportation Infrastructure Committee and the House Aviation Subcommittee, we will review FAA's plans for implementing ADS-B. Specifically, our objectives are to (1) examine key risks to FAA's successful implementation of ADS-B and (2) assess the strengths and weaknesses of FAA's proposed contracting approach.
