On October 30, 2008, Representative Jerry F. Costello, Chairman of the House Subcommittee on Aviation, requested that we review the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) processes for screening, placing, and training newly hired air traffic controllers. Specifically, the Chairman expressed concerns about whether FAA's screening test, Air Traffic Selection and Training, or AT-SAT, effectively identifies candidates' potential to become air traffic controllers and whether the FAA Academy adequately trains candidates before FAA places them at facilities.

Accordingly, we plan to review these FAA processes. Our audit objectives are to assess (1) how FAA determines whether candidates have the requisite abilities to become successful controllers, (2) what procedures FAA uses to place controllers at air traffic facilities, and (3) whether the initial training at the FAA Academy adequately prepares controller candidates for facility training.
