Commercial Vehicle Classes

A = Any combination of vehicles (GVWR) over 26,000 lbs. provided GVWR of towed vehicles is over 10,000 lbs.



C = Any single vehicle less than 26,000 lbs. GVWR (or any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of 10,000 lbs. GVWR) transporting hazardous materials in amounts requiring placarding (requires "H" or "H" & "N" or "X" endorsement), or designed to transport 16+ persons, including the driver (requires "P" endorsement).

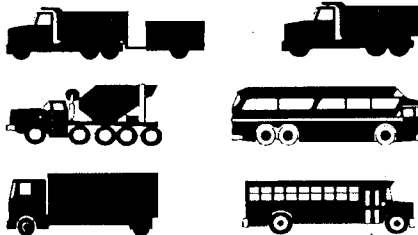


Non-Commercial Vehicle Classes

(Fields 38 and 70) INJURY CODE INSTRUCTIONS

Mark only one bubble which indicates the most severe injury for the operator and/or occupant:

Table with 4 columns of injury codes: K = FATAL INJURY, A = INCAPACITATING INJURY, B = NONINCAPACITATING INJURY, C = POSSIBLE INJURY, N = NO APPARENT INJURY.

(Fields 39 and 71) SEATING POSITIONS

Table with 2 columns of seating positions: 1-9 (Front, Second, Third Row - Left, Middle, Right Side), 10-16 (Sleeper Section of Cab, Passenger in Enclosed/Unenclosed, Trailing Unit, Riding on Exterior, Pedestrian, Unknown).

(Fields 40 and 72) SAFETY EQUIPMENT CODES

Table with 2 columns of safety equipment codes: 0-4 (None Used, Shoulder/Lap Belt, Lap Belt Only, Shoulder Belt Only, Child Safety Seat), 5-9 (Helmet Used, Helmet and Eye Protection, No Helmet - Eye Protection Only, Not Applicable, Restraint Use Unknown).

(Field 95)

EXTENT OF DAMAGE

NONE = No apparent damage to the vehicle.

VERY MINOR = Damage of a cosmetic nature, e.g.; paint scratches, tire scuff marks, bumper rub marks, etc. ... no dents or missing trim pieces.

MINOR = Vehicle is dented but repairable, e.g.; blown tire(s), broken windshield or window, missing trim pieces, small dents but no creased metal parts.

MODERATE = Vehicle quarter panels are dented or creased. Broken or missing parts can either be replaced or repaired. Vehicle frame or unibody are not damaged. Includes engine compartment fires.

SEVERE = Vehicle not driveable but can be salvaged.

VERY SEVERE = Vehicle is not salvageable. Examples: extensive vehicle damage due to impact of collision, vehicle fire, and vehicle rollover damaging all areas of the vehicle.

UNKNOWN = Extent of vehicle damage is unknown to the investigating officer. Examples include: Vehicle repaired prior to the police investigation, vehicle returned to the home state after accident, and unidentified hit and run vehicle fleeing accident scene.

(Field 106) TOWED UNIT AND TRAILER PLATE TYPE INSTRUCTIONS

If a trailer or towed unit is involved in an accident, use the following abbreviations to identify the TOWED UNIT and TRAILER PLATE TYPE on the last two lines of the narrative:
