



THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S BUILD AMERICA BUREAU ("THE BUREAU"):

• Is responsible for driving transportation infrastructure development projects in the United States. The Bureau streamlines credit opportunities and grants and provides access to the credit and grant programs with more speed and transparency, while also providing technical assistance and encouraging innovative best practices in project planning, financing, delivery, and monitoring. To achieve this vision, the Bureau draws upon the full resources of U.S. DOT to best utilize the expertise of all the modes within the Department while promoting a culture of innovation and customer service.

• Builds upon the foundation established by the Build America Transportation Investment Center (the "BATIC") which has served as the single point of contact and coordination for states, municipalities and project sponsors looking to utilize federal transportation expertise, apply for federal transportation credit programs and explore ways to access private capital in public private partnerships.

• Combines the BATIC, TIFIA and RRIF loan programs, Private Activity Bonds (PABs), and the new \$800 million FASTLANE grant program all under one roof within the Office of the Undersecretary for Transportation Policy.
