RE: CPF 1-2013-5019 Buckeye Partners, L.P. – New Haven, CT to Springfield, MA Pipeline Inspection - Notice of Probable Violation

Dear Mr. Coy:

Buckeye Partners, L.P. (Buckeye) has reviewed the referenced Notice of Probable Violation, Proposed Civil Penalty, and Proposed Compliance Order (NOPV) received on September 13, 2013 from the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration relating to the September 2012 inspection of Buckeye's pipeline facilities between New Haven, CT and Springfield, MA.

Buckeye does not contest the items of the probable violations in the NOPV, and provides additional information regarding each item. Buckeye has made payment of the proposed civil penalty in the amount of \$69,100.

Referencing Item 1, Buckeye has filed a supplemental 2011 Annual Report (Report Number 20120359-12489) correcting the number of breakout tanks in Massachusetts from six to four. Buckeye will institute a revised process using its new tank database and local Operations input to ensure correct number of breakout tanks on future Annual Report submissions.

Regarding Item 2, the five inspections listed in the NOPV were performed within the fifteen month inspection interval, but missed the calendar year interval for 2011 by three days. Buckeye has reviewed the calendar year inspection interval requirements with its Operations personnel responsible for the New Haven to Springfield facilities. Buckeye will also be enhancing its compliance monitoring with Operations personnel to ensure completion of these future calendar year compliance requirements.

Referencing Item 3, Buckeye will adequately inspect the surface conditions of the pipeline right of way in the two areas listed in the NOPV using ground patrols until the tree canopy can be cut, which is scheduled for 2014.

Buckeye is committed to operating its pipeline facilities in a safe and responsible manner to ensure the safety of the public, the environment and its employees.
