The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) has reviewed your letter received on February 14, 2012, notifying us that the California Office of the State Fire Marshal (CSFM) proposes to grant Valero Benicia Refinery (Valero) a waiver from 49 CFR 195.306(b)(1). Valero requested that CSFM modify compliance with 49 CFR 195.306(b)(1) as adopted by the State of California pursuant to section 51011 of the California Code, and allow Valero to test the following pipelines using high flash diesel fuel as the test medium:

This proposed waiver by the CSFM would allow Valero to use high flash diesel fuel instead of liquid petroleum as the test medium for approximately 8.4 miles of the above pipelines located in Solano County, CA. You have confirmed that each of these pipelines have been previously tested successfully using high-flash diesel as the test medium.

PHMSA does not object to CSFM's waiver of 49 CFR 195.306 (b)(1) providing that CSFM impose the following conditions:

- 1. Test shall be conducted only during daylight hours.
- 2. The test pressure shall not exceed 26% SMYS or the 2007 test pressure.
