## Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration

DOT-SP 10784 (TENTH REVISION)

(FOR RENEWAL, SEE 49 CFR § 107.109)

- 1. GRANTEE: (See individual authorization letter)
- 2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of First Aid/Trauma Kits (FAT Kits) containing a Division 2.2 gas in the passenger compartment of commercial aircraft. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
  - c. The terms of this special permit are limited to government purposes only.
  - d. Unless otherwise stated herein, this special permit consists of the special permit authorization letter issued to the grantee together with this document.
- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR Part 172, Subparts C and D in that marking and labeling are waived, § 173.25 in that the requirement for marking is waived, and § 175.75 (b) in that the kits are authorized for transportation in the passenger cabin, except as specified herein.
- 5. BASIS: This special permit is based on the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration's (PHMSA) editorial review under § 107.121 initiated on December 4, 2008.

## 6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

## 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

- a. PACKAGING Prescribed packaging is a DOT Specification 3AA2015 cylinder containing oxygen which is contained in the FAT Kit. The FAT Kit is constructed of ballistic nylon in the shape of a carry-on suitcase.
- b. MARKING The requirements of 49 CFR Part 172, Subpart C and D pertaining to special permit markings on the package and shipping papers and the shipping paper requirements, respectively, are waived. The outside of each FAT Kit does not have to be marked as prescribed by § 173.25.
- c. The requirements \$173.302(f)(3)\$ for an outer packaging are waived.
- 8. <u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS:</u> None as a requirement of this special permit.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Passenger-carrying aircraft.
- 10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each aircraft used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The air carrier must be notified of the use of this special permit before or at the time of the transport of the FAT Kit.

- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE:</u> Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law. 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et</u> seq:
  - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - O Registration required by § 107.602 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8 who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by § 172.700 through § 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when the special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) - 'The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005' (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this exemption are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials

incidents, and 171.16 Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
