1. <u>GRANTEE</u>: The Gillette Company (Former Grantee: The Proctor & Gamble Company) Boston, MA

### 2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

a. This special permit authorizes the manufacture, mark, sale and use of non-refillable inside containers which are leak tested by an automated in-line pressure check in lieu of the hot water bath specified in the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.

b. The safety analyses performed in the development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with the transportation in commerce.

- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR § 173.306(a)(3)(v) in that the use of leakage test other than a hot water bath is not authorized, except as specified herein.
- 5. <u>BASIS</u>: This special permit is based on the application of The Proctor & Gamble Company dated September 25, 2013 submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

#### 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Packagings prescribed are non-DOT specification non-refillable inside metal containers described as "bag on valve" containers. The product discharge valve is attached to an inner laminate bag creating a "bag on valve" which is then inserted into the metal container and affixed by a crimping process. The inner bag is filled with product, and the space between the inner bag and the metal container is filled with compressed air. The pressure in the metal container must be less than 140 psig at 130°F. The containers must be in accordance with drawings on file with the Approvals and Permits Division.

## b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS -

(1) In lieu of a hot water bath test each completed container must be subjected to an automated in-line pressure check.

(2) If the pressure measured on any container during the in-line pressure check is less than 40 psig or above 123 psig, then that container must be rejected.

#### 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. In accordance with the provisions of Paragraph (b) of § 173.22a, persons may use the packaging authorized by this special permit for the transportation of the hazardous materials specified in paragraph 6, only in conformance with the terms of this special permit.

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b. A person who is not a holder of this special permit, but receives a packaging covered by this special permit, may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the packaging and it is offered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.

c. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

d. Each packaging manufactured under the authority of this special permit must be either (1) marked with the <u>name of</u> the <u>manufacturer and location (city and state) of the</u> facility at which it is manufactured or (2) marked with a <u>registration symbol</u> designated by the Office of Hazardous Materials Special Permits and Approvals <u>for a specific</u> manufacturing facility.

e. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the packaging is manufactured under this special permit. It must be made available to a DOT representative upon request.

f. Containers filled with a material that meets the definition of a "Consumer commodity" in § 171.8 may be reclassed as ORM-D and shipped as "Consumer commodity" in accordance with § 173.306(i).

g. Each container must be marked "DOT-SP 15427" as specified in § 172.301(c) and shipped in a strong outside packaging.

- 9. <u>MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED</u>: Motor vehicle, rail freight, cargo vessel, cargo aircraft only, and passengercarrying aircraft.
- 10. <u>MODAL REQUIREMENTS</u>: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each cargo vessel and aircraft, used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The shipper must furnish a current copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.

- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et seq</u>:
  - All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601  $\underline{\text{et seq.}}$ , when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)—"The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 Detailed hazardous materials Continuation of DOT-SP 15427 (2nd Rev.)

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incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
