1. GRANTEE: Textron Inc.  
Wilmington, MA
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This special permit authorizes the offering in commerce of a Division 1.1D explosive material which is forbidden for transportation by air, to be transported by cargo aircraft. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce. The safety analyses did not consider the hazards and risks associated with consumer use, use as a component of a transport vehicle or other device, or other uses not associated with transportation in commerce.
  - c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
  - d. This special permit will not be renewed.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR §§ 172.101 Column (9B), 172.204(c) (3), 173.27(b) (2) (3) in that the Class 1 materials are forbidden for air transportation, except as provided herein and § 172.301(c) in that the marking requirements are waived.

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5. BASIS: This special permit is based on the application of Textron Inc. dated March 5, 2014 submitted in accordance with § 107.109.
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:
- a. PACKAGING - As prescribed in § 173.62.
- b. The Division 1.1D explosives identified in paragraph 6. above may be transported by cargo aircraft when offered by Textron Systems Corp., Wilmington, MA and transported by Atlas Air Inc., Miami FL in accordance with this special permit and DOT-SP 15631.
- c. Transportation is authorized one-way from McAlester Army Ammunition Plant in McAlester, OK, to Atlas Air from Kansas City International Airport, (MCI), to UAE Air Force & Air Defense in AlDhafra (OMAM) in, United Arab Emirates.
- d. No more than six shipments may be transported under the terms of this special permit.
- e. The grantee must maintain a record of all activity conducted under the authority granted in this special permit. The record must contain a listing of the number of shipments and dates of shipments.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS: A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.
9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Cargo aircraft.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each aircraft used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The shipper must furnish a copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
  
11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
  - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)—"The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
