1. <u>GRANTEE:</u> Conair Corporation East Windsor, NJ

2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain used DOT 3AL cylinders that contain carbon dioxide, but not necessarily in an amount to qualify as a hazardous material. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.

b. The safety analyses performed in development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce. The safety analyses did not consider the hazards and risks associated with consumer use, use as a component of a transport vehicle or other device, or other uses not associated with transportation in commerce.

c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.

- 3. <u>REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED</u>: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR § 171.2(k) in that no person may, by marking or otherwise, represent that a hazardous material is present in a package, container, or motor vehicle if the hazardous material is not present, § 172.202(a) (5) (iii) (B) in that the number of cylinders need not be identified on the shipping papers, and Subpart H of Part 172 that prescribes training for hazmat employees, except as provided herein.

- 5. <u>BASIS</u>: This special permit is based on the application of Conair Corporation dated April 18, 2013 submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
- 6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. $\underline{\texttt{PACKAGING}}$ - Prescribed packaging is as required by the <code>HMR</code>.

b. <u>OPERATIONAL CONTROLS</u> - Conair Corporation is responsible as the offeror for all shipments made under this special permit. The carrier will verify package compliance at the collection point on behalf of Conair Corporation prior to accepting the shipment.

c. Cylinders that are less than 29 psig may be shipped as hazardous material, i.e. carbon dioxide, 2.2.

d. In place of the training requirements specified in subpart H of Part 172, persons offering the cylinders for transportation must comply with the closure instructions accompanying the fiberboard box.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a completed package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modifications or changes are made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.

b. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at all Conair Corporation facilities that provide packagings for, offer, or receive the DOT 3AL cylinders. c. The instructions for properly preparing the cylinders and closing the fiberboard box must be printed on or permanently affixed to the outside of the box.

d. <u>MARKING</u> - The outer package provided by Conair Corporation must be marked "DOT-SP 15851."

- 9. <u>MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED</u>: Motor Vehicle, cargo aircraft, cargo vessel, rail freight.
- 10. <u>MODAL REQUIREMENTS</u>: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each cargo aircraft and cargo vessel used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The shipper must furnish a current copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipments is tendered.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et seq</u>:
 - All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
 - o Registration required by § 107.601 $\underline{\text{et seq.}}$, when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)-"The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security

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Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
