¹ The State of Tennessee provides funds directly to localities by means of budgetary authority via Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA) 54-4-103 (counties, gas & diesel tax), TCA 54-4-204 (cities, gas & diesel tax), & TCA 67-3-906 (cities and counties, special petroleum tax). State law requires that these funds be spent for transportation purposes, however, it is left to the local government entity to determine what type of transportation projects (highway infrastructure, transit, etc.) these funds are ultimately used to implement. Tennessee has chosen to include these funds totaling \$472,803,622 in the "Highway Infrastructure Investment" - Federal Highway Administration, "Covered Program" for reporting purposes.
