Re: Certification under Section 1201 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act

Dear Mr. Secretary:

This is in response to your letter of February 9, 2010, regarding additional guidance on Section 1201 certification and reporting under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). We are providing you with the amended Maintenance of Effort (MOE) certifications amounts to adhere to your recommended method of calculation.

Pursuant to Title XII, section 1201 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act [Pub. L. 111-5 (Feb. 17, 2009)] ("ARRA"), I, Jennifer M. Granholm, the Governor of the State of Michigan, hereby certify to the Secretary of Transportation that the State of Michigan will maintain its effort with regard to State funding for the types of projects in Department of Transportation (DOT) "covered programs" funded under ARRA. The enclosure list of DOT "covered programs" identifies the amount of funds the State plans to expend from State sources from February 17, 2009, to September 30, 2010, for the types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA.

I understand that if the State of Michigan is unable to maintain the level of funding identified in this list of types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA, the State of Michigan will thereafter be prohibited by the Secretary of Transportation from receiving additional limitation on obligations for Federal-aid highway and highway safety construction programs that occurs after August 1 for fiscal year 2011.
