
Dear Secretary Hood.

Pursuant to Title XII, section 1201 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Pub. L. 11105 (Feb. 17, 2009) ("ARRA"), I, John Elias Baldacci, the Governor of the State of Maine, hereby certify to the Secretary of Transportation that the State of Maine will maintain its effort with regard to the State funding for the types of projects in DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA. The enclosure list of DOT "covered programs" identifies the amount of funds the State plans to expend from State sources from February 17, 2009 to September 30, 2010, for the types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA.

I understand that if the State of Maine is unable to maintain the level of funding identified in this list of the types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA, the State of Maine will thereafter be prohibited by the Secretary of Transportation from receiving additional limitation on obligations for Federal-aid highway and highway safety construction programs that occurs after August 1 for fiscal year 2011.
