The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 has provided Pennsylvania with urgently needed revenues and tax relief. Accordingly, I am pleased to submit the enclosed section of 1511 certification covering the addition of three ARRA funded projects and modification of fifteen existing ARRA funded projects. These adjustments have been made possible due to realized bid savings to date.

Pennsylvania has made and will continue to make good use of these funds to tackle the backlogs in vehicle replacements and facility upgrades. In addition to helping the transit systems maintain critically needed services, the ARRA money will mean job preservation and creation across Pennsylvania. With rising unemployment, Pennsylvania welcomes this financial infusion that has already made a difference for our citizens.

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation worked cooperatively with our 23 Metropolitan and Rural Planning Organizations in securing consensus to program the additional/modified ARRA funded projects.

Pennsylvania commends the Obama Administration and the U.S. Congress for making these economic recovery funds available to us and the other states. We will make wise use of these resources.

## **CERTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 1511 OF**

## THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT:

Pursuant to Title XV, Subtitle A, Section 1511 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Pub. L. 111-5, Feb. 17, 2009) ("ARRA"), I, Governor Edward G. Rendell\*, hereby certify that the attached infrastructure investments funded with amounts appropriated by ARRA under the headings: "Highway Infrastructure Investment" to the Federal Highway Administration, or "Transit Capital Assistance," "Fixed Guideway Infrastructure Investment," or "Capital Investment Grants" to the Federal Transit Administration, have received the full review and vetting required by law and that I accept responsibility that such investments are appropriate uses of taxpayer dollars.
