SUBJECT: July 2010 Civil Reserve Air Fleet (CRAF) Allocation

The April 2010 CRAF allocation issued April 7, 2010 is hereby amended. The distribution reflected in this letter, effective July 1, 2010, brings the CRAF allocations up-to-date. The Alaska section consists of four cargo aircraft. The Domestic section consists of 36 aircraft. The Aeromedical Evacuation segment consists of 39 aircraft. The Short-Range International section consists of 9 cargo and 320 passenger aircraft. The Long-Range International section consists of 234 cargo and 529 passenger aircraft. Total aircraft in the CRAF program is 1,171.
