SUBJECT: July 2011 Civil Reserve Air Fleet (CRAF) Allocation

The April 2011 CRAF allocation issued April 8, 2011 is hereby amended. The distribution reflected in this letter, effective July 1, 2011, brings the CRAF allocations up-to-date. The Alaska section consists of four cargo aircraft. The Domestic section consists of 36 aircraft. The Aeromedical Evacuation segment consists of 39 aircraft. The Short-Range International section consists of 4 cargo and 409 passenger aircraft. The Long-Range International section consists of 167 cargo and 240 passenger aircraft. Total aircraft in the CRAF program is 899.
